

Chaplain Catechist (Chaplain for Religious Education)

Episcopal High School is seeking a Chaplain Catechist to coordinate and develop the religious education of our diverse community of students, faculty, staff members, parents, and alumni (2000+ souls). Formation at Episcopal High School means orienting our loves and training our attention so that we might live lives of meaning. It is rooted in Jesus' interpretation of the Law as love of God and Love of Neighbor, and is a collaborative effort across several disciplines. The Chaplain for Catechist plays a key role in this collaboration, anchoring our efforts in the hope of the Gospel and the best traditions of the Episcopal Church.

Essential Functions (Reports to Dean of Religion and Religion Department Chair):

- Teach 4 sections (2+ preps) of Religion Department classes per semester. Course assignments made in conversation with the Religion Department Chair based on education and academic interest.
- Develop and produce programming to promote Christian formation and deepen community understanding of our shared tradition. Legacy programs that demonstrate these goals include:
 - Canterbury Circle (modeled on Episcopal Church college ministry).
 - Sacramental Preparation classes (Baptism and Confirmation)
- Liaise with clubs, programs, and parachurch programs present on campus (FCA, YoungLife, Moms In Prayer, etc.) for mutual support and accountability.
- Share in the ministries of word, sacrament, and pastoral care with the other ordained members of the school faculty/staff.
- Other duties as assigned.

Experience:

- Ordination to the Priesthood and good standing in The Episcopal Church.
 - Canonically resident in the Diocese of Texas, or willing to seek letters dimissory to join the Diocese.
- MDiv or equivalent degree in Christian Scriptures, History, World Religions, or Ethics.
- Prior teaching experience preferred.
