Texas was administered as a Foreign Mission from 1838 to 1845, being visited by Bishop Polk of Louisiana and Bishop Freeman of Arkansas. When Texas became a state of the union in 1845, it continued under the care of Bishop Freeman.

The Diocese of Texas was organized in 1849 and continued under Bishop Freeman's care until Bishop Gregg was consecrated. The original diocese, comprising the whole state, was divided in 1874. Since that time, the Diocese of Texas has been made up of the 57 counties of southeast and east Texas, viz: that portion of the State of Texas lying south of the northern line of the counties of Lampasas, Coryell, McLennan, Limestone, Freestone, Anderson, Smith, Gregg, and Marion, and east of the western line of the counties of Matagorda, Colorado, Fayette, Bastrop, Travis, Burnet, and Lampasas.



PART I – THE 162ND COUNCIL

PROCEEDINGS OF THE 162nd COUNCIL

The 162nd Annual Council of the Diocese of Texas opened on Friday evening, February 12, 2011, at six o'clock, with a celebration of the Holy Eucharist at Trinity Church, The Woodlands. The Right Reverend C. Andrew Doyle, Bishop of Texas, was the celebrant of the liturgy. The preacher for the liturgy was the Reverend William C. Treadwell, Rector, Saint Paul's Church, Waco. Assisting Bishop Doyle in the Holy Eucharist were the Right Reverend Rayford B. High, Jr. and the Right Reverend Dena Harrison, Bishops Suffragan of Texas; the Right Reverend Claude E. Payne and the Right Reverend Maurice M. Benetiz, Bishops of Texas, retired; the Right Reverend Humphrey Peters, Bishop of Pakistan; the Reverend Russell Oechsel, Archdeacon; and the Reverend Victoria Mason and the Reverend Robert Horner, Deacons. The Bishops were assisted in the administration of the Holy Communion by the diocesan canons and the clergy and laity of the host congregations.

FIRST SESSION Saturday, February 13, 2011

At 8:30 on Saturday morning, in the Convention Center of The Woodlands Waterway Marriott Hotel, the 162nd Annual Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas was called to order by the Bishop, C. Andrew Doyle. The Bishop announced that the Reverend Beth Holden had been appointed as chaplain to the 162nd Council. He asked that the Chaplain place the Bible on the rostrum and lead Council in an opening prayer for the Reverend Joseph Spitler, priest of the Diocese of Texas, following his death the day before, and for the 162nd Council.

After announcing that 219 clergy and 438 lay delegates had registered by eight fifteen, the Secretary, in order to establish a quorum, first asked one delegate from each congregation to stand and then asked all the clergy to stand. The Secretary then certified that a quorum was present.

Beginning the report concerning Credentials, the Secretary announced that there were no congregations in arrears to the Church Pension Fund. The Secretary then

moved that all licensed clergy who function as heads of congregations and those who are licensed to serve as assisting clergy or on the staff of diocesan congregations be admitted to Council with seat and voice but no vote. The motion was seconded. There being no objection, the motion was declared by the Bishop as adopted.

The Secretary announced that there were three Episcopal Fellowships in the diocese operating under the authority of Canon 12.12: The Fellowship of the Prodigal, Round Rock; St. Mary Magdalene, Manor; and San Pablo, Houston. In accordance with the provisions of the Canon, the Secretary suggested that the Bishop recommend to Council that they be given seat and voice (but no vote). The motion was then moved and seconded. There being no objection, the motion was declared by the Bishop as adopted.

The Secretary announced that there were six congregations that had not completed the payment of their Diocesan Assessment and as such were not entitled to representation at Council: St. Peter's, Lago Vista; Holy Cross, Sugar Land; Good Shepherd, Tomball; Trinity Church, Galveston; Church of the Redeemer, Houston; and St. Luke the Evangelist, Houston.

Bishop Doyle asked the Council make an exception in the case of the following congregations (all of whom were in the process of recovery): Good Shepherd, Tomball; Holy Cross, Sugar Land; St. Peter's, Lago Vista; Trinity Church, Galveston; and Church of the Redeemer, Houston. The motion to remit their unpaid assessments and to seat these five congregations with voice and vote was made on behalf of the Finance Committee of the Executive Board. There being no objection, the motion was declared by the Bishop as adopted.

Bishop Doyle appointed the following college delegates and alternates to the 162nd Council: Baylor, Christine Brunson, Lara Case (alternate); Rice, Janna Stover, Olivia Grady (alternate); Sam Houston State, Rebecca Alard, Chris Felder (alternate); Southwestern, Natalie Thaddeus; Texas A&M, Jacob Hammond, Erica Peaslee (alternate); University of Texas (Austin), Alex Easley.

The Bishop announced that the 162nd Council was now organized for business. The Bishop then announced that he had appointed Dennis Clark as Parliamentarian for the 162nd Council and that David Harvin was present as Chancellor of the Diocese.

The chair of the Committee on Dispatch of Business presented the Special Rules of Procedure as printed in the Order of Business booklet and moved their adoption. There being no discussion, the motion was adopted by a two-thirds standing vote. The committee chair then moved the adoption of the Council's Order of Business itself as also printed in the Order of Business booklet. The motion was adopted on a voice vote.

The Secretary announced that there was no unfinished business from the 161st Council and certified that the minutes of the 161st Council as published in Volume II of the Journal of the 161st Council to be a true and accurate record of the proceedings of that Council. The Bishop then attested to the validity of the minutes of the 161st Council as a true and accurate record of the proceedings of that Council.

The Bishop made the following appointments to fill vacancies on regular committees of Council: to Dispatch of Business, Paul Skeith (St. David's, Austin); to Nominations, the Reverend Janice Jones, chair, (Grace Church, Georgetown), Mike Tomsu, ex-officio as Vice Chancellor, (St. Michael's, Austin), the Reverend Margaret Waters, to 2012 (St. Alban's, Austin), and Mike Shobe, to 2013 (Christ Church, Temple); to Supervisors and Tellers, Jimmy Abbott, for 2011 (St. Alban's, Waco).

Mary MacGregor, chair of the Committee on New Parishes and Missions, made the following report:

Right Reverend Sir, Clergy, and Delegates. On behalf of the Committee on Missions and Parishes, I want to highlight some of the 2010 congregational development work completed and the 2011 work that is underway, all of which is grounded in the mission and vision of the Diocese of Texas.

Significant work started the week after Council last year, when four members of the Diocese of Texas congregational development team took our Warden's & Vestry Conference "on the road" to the Diocese of Ft. Worth. One hundred and thirty lay and clergy leaders from that diocese enthusiastically attended this event at All Saints' Episcopal Church. This conference was followed over the next four weeks with three regional Warden's and Vestry Conferences in our diocese with over 550 people in attendance.

I would like to report to this Council that Bob Schorr and myself worked on location in 2010 with 34 churches, often with multiple visits to the same communities. And, our congregational coaches were deployed to work on location with 17 churches. They too, often with multiple visits to the same congregations. This amounts to significant work with 51 different congregations, <u>about one-third of our churches in one year</u>. The reasons were myriad: from visioning, to vestry and leadership development, search committee training to conflict resolution, newcomer ministry assessment to building and property issues. Each of these visits were the result of being invited to partner with our congregations to address their specific needs.

I am pleased to report that our two newest greenfield plants are thriving. St. Julian of Norwich in northwest Austin, which was received as a mission at our last Council, is making significant progress under the creative leadership of its vicar, the Rev'd Miles Brandon. And, St. Mary Magdalene in Manor, northeast of Austin, held their first public worship service in September. This multi-lingual congregation is growing under the gifted leadership of the Rev'd Alex Montes-Vela.

As the Diocese of Texas looks to develop a multitude of new congregations over the coming decades, we are encouraging extraordinary and creative initiatives from you, our congregations, to birth, satellite, second campus, and establish unique forms of gathering places where new congregations can be started for worship, mission, and ministry.

Two examples are Grace, Georgetown, which has a second campus with over 80 people, and St. Mark's, Houston, which has established St. Mark's Between the Bayous, which in a few short months has drawn a group of 30 to gather for worship and fellowship in a 1912 school building that has been repurposed as a community art center. This effort is being led by the Rev'd James Derkits.

We celebrate the move of St. Mark's, Rosenberg, to the George Ranch area and the additional purchase of land with a vision for growth, a thoughtful strategy planned by generous lay leaders and their inspiring late rector, Janet Gilmore. This work now continues at St. Mark's with the very capable leadership of the Rev'd Bert Baetz.

We are thankful for the commitment and dedication of the good people of St. John's, Tyler, an historic African American congregation, who has just re-dedicated their completely refurbished church, providing a beautiful new space for mission and ministry in that northeast community.

We are in conversation with two churches seriously considering second campuses. We are also visiting with a few more of our faith communities which are in prayerful discernment around the opportunity to birth new congregations in unique ways. The Bishop has appointed a Vision Task Force led by the Rev'd Jeff Fisher, to work with us and congregations interested in expansion work as we live into the future, challenged to build the Kingdom of God together. We look forward to watching how God inspires and leads the congregations of the Diocese of Texas into undertaking this holy evangelical work.

We also want to report to this council that after over 70 years of remarkable ministry, often that has impacted the entire Episcopal church in countless ways, the Church of the Redeemer will celebrate its last service at its current building on February 27. This congregation is a witness to their remarkable faith. Daniel Coleman, Sr. warden, and Redeemer's vestry and leaders have worked collaboratively with the diocesan staff during this time. They have modeled grace and patience as they face this dramatic change. They seek your prayers as they pursue another location for meeting and invite you to join in their celebration, Redeemer style, on Sunday, February 27, at their location east of downtown Houston.

We also know that every church, no matter the size, is called to be missionary. That the work of evangelism starts with a personal invitation and the sharing of the Good News of God in Christ and that <u>every</u> congregation can improve the ways it invites, welcomes, and connects new persons into relationship with them. To this end, we have undertaken a significant Newcomer Initiative Project which seeks to assist churches in cultivating new practices for the invitation, welcome, and connection of newcomers.

Mary Parmer, one of our talented congregational coaches, is spearheading the program and working closely with us. Her significant experience and expertise in this area have already impacted the four pilot congregations she has worked with. Outstanding assessment tools have been created for our congregations and more resources are in the works. The assessment tools will be available on the new diocesan Web site next week. And, we look forward to offering additional significant and creative resources for your church at the Bishop's Conference on Evangelism, which will be held at Camp Allen next fall.

This conference will be unique, inspiring, and resourceful. It is being designed for you, clergy and lay leaders, to assist the fostering of evangelism in your church in powerful ways. Put the date of November 11– 12, 2011, on your calendars now and plan to bring a crowd. We plan to fill Camp Allen for this special event!

We know that healthy, vital, and growing congregations depend on clergy who feel supported and are resourced for the challenging work they are called to do. Toward that end the Iona Center which is the collective diocesan effort for clergy, lay, and congregational development, supports numerous gathering opportunities for clergy including nine facilitated clericus groups, semi-annual bi-vocational priest/clericus retreats, a deacon's clericus, a church planter's group, and a new group this spring for clergy who serve in congregations that require significant redevelopment efforts.

Successful clergy leadership and healthy congregational development go hand in hand. The Diocese of Texas is committed to supporting both.

Be assured that we will continue to work for you as lay leaders, your congregations, and all of you who serve as clergy. Together, we will strive to be One Church, reconciled by Jesus Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, called by God through worship, witness, and ministry, building the Kingdom of God together.

After requesting Bishop High to assume the chair, Bishop Doyle made his address to the 162nd Annual Council (a printed copy of which can be found elsewhere in this volume).

The motion was made and passed on a voice vote to accept the Bishop's address. Bishop Doyle resumed the chair.

David Harvin, chancellor, in the place of Maria Boyce, chair of the Committee on Constitution and Canons, presented the initial report of that committee with the following proposed amendments to Canon 9.1 and 9.2, Canon 43.2, Canon 44, and Canon 49 (new number).

Canon 9 THE VESTRY

PROPOSED:

Section 9.1 Election at Parish Meetings

In each Parish shall be chosen from the qualified voters not less than three nor more than eighteen communicants to serve as members of the vestry. The number and the manner of electing the same shall be determined from time to time by the Parish at the annual Parish Meeting. The Parish Meeting at which the election takes place may be held no earlier than October 1st nor later than the annual Parish Meeting, as the vestry may determine, public notice of such election in any case to be given during the stated services the two (2) Sundays preceding; provided that, except to fill vacancies, the vestry members so elected shall not take office until the adjournment of the annual Parish Meeting, which shall be held on the first Monday in January or as soon thereafter as convenient, public notice of such annual Parish Meeting in any case to be given during the stated services the Sunday preceding.

(a) <u>Regular m</u>Members of the vestry shall regularly be elected to serve for three years, and shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified, and their terms shall be so arranged that one-third shall go out of office each year. In new Parishes, when the Vestry is first chosen, one-third of the Vestry shall be chosen for one year, one-third for two years, and one-third for three years, the full term thereafter to be three years.

(b) <u>A Parish may decide to have one or two youth members of the vestry in addition to the regular members.</u> Youth members of the vestry must meet all qualifications of vestry members specified in this Canon, except that they are required to be only 16 years of age. A Parish that

chooses to have youth members of the vestry has the following options, to be determined from time to time by the Parish at the annual Parish Meeting:

- (1) The term of office for youth members of a vestry may be for fewer than three years.
- (2) The term of office for youth members of a vestry may begin at a date other than the adjournment of the annual Parish Meeting.
- (3) Youth members of a vestry either (a) may have voice, but no vote or (b) may vote except when the vote involves issues where a person under the age of 18 does not have capacity under Texas law.

(b)(c) No person shall serve as member of the Vestry until he or she shall have subscribed to the following declaration:

"I am persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain all doctrine required as necessary for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ; and I accede to the Doctrine, Discipline, and Worship of the Protestant Episcopal Church."

(c)(d) In case a vacancy shall occur, the Vestry shall fill the vacancy until the next annual election by electing a communicant from the qualified voters of the Parish, and the Congregation shall then fill the unexpired term. Members of the Vestry chosen to fill unexpired terms, shall, like those elected for full terms, be communicants and qualified voters of the Parish.

(d)(e) No retiring member of the Vestry elected by the Congregation for a full term, shall be eligible for re-election until a period of one year shall have elapsed, unless approved in writing by the Bishop.

Section 9.2 Persons Eligible to Vote – Definitions of Confirmed Communicant and Communicant in Good Standing

Men and women at least 16 years of age, who are enrolled confirmed communicants in good standing of the Parish, are entitled to vote for members of the Vestry and upon all questions requiring the action of the Congregation, but none shall be admitted to serve as <u>regular</u> members of the Vestry except those who are at least 18 years of age. <u>If a Parish determines to have them, youth members of a Vestry must be at least 16 years of age at the time their term begins.</u> Voting may be by absentee ballot under such rules and regulations as may have been established at a prior Parish Meeting.

For the purpose of Canon 9.2, an enrolled communicant in good standing of a Parish is a communicant in good standing who is enrolled as such in the records of such Parish.

For purpose of the Canons, a confirmed communicant or confirmed communicant in good standing is a communicant or communicant in good standing who has been confirmed by a Bishop of the Episcopal Church or a Bishop of a Church in communion with the Episcopal Church or has been received into the Episcopal Church by a Bishop of the Episcopal Church.

For purpose of the Canons, a communicant in good standing is a communicant who for the previous year has been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

For purpose of the Canons, a communicant in good standing is a communicant who for the previous year has been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

Canon 43 MORAL DISCIPLINE

PROPOSED:

Section 43.1 Obligation

All members of the clergy, having subscribed to the Declaration required by Article VIII of the Constitution of the Episcopal Church, shall be under obligation to model in their own lives the received teaching of the Church that all of its members are to abstain from sexual relations outside Holy Matrimony.

Section 43.2 Definitions

As used in this Diocese, Holy Matrimony shall mean the physical and spiritual union of a man and a woman, entered into within the community of faith, by mutual consent of the heart, mind, and will, and with intent that it be lifelong; and the moral qualifications of a person, as that term is used in the Canons of the Episcopal Church, shall include conformity to the obligation set forth in Section 43.1 hereof.

Canon 44 DISCIPLINE

PROPOSED:

Section 44.1 Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church

In all matters of ecclesiastical discipline, effective JanuaryJuly 1, 1996,2011, the Diocese shall follow and be governed by Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church as adopted at General Convention in 1994,2009, and as amended from time to time hereafter. Except as otherwise expressly provided or when the content otherwise requires, capitalized words as used in this Canon shall have the same meanings as those set forth in Title IV, Canon XV2 of the Canons of the Episcopal Church. The predecessor to this Diocesan Canon shall stand repealed on July 1, 2011.

Section 44.2 Ecclesiastical Trial Court Disciplinary Board

There shall be within and for the Diocese an Ecclesiastical Trial Court for the Trial of any Priest or Deacon of the Diocese (excludes a Bishop)a Disciplinary Board consisting of seven members, four Priests or Deacons, whose actual residence and canonical residence is within this Diocese, and three lay adult confirmed communicants in good standing of the Church in this Diocese. A member of the Standing Committee may serve on the Disciplinary Board. Annually, within two months following each Annual Diocesan Council. the members of the **Ecclesiastical** Trial CourtDisciplinary Board shall elect a Presiding JudgePresident from its members. The Presiding JudgePresident shall serve for a term of one year and until his or her successor is hereby elected and gualified. The Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall make provision for a Church Attorney to be appointed by the Standing Committee to serve for a term of one year and until his or her successor is duly appointed and qualified. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Church Attorney, the Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall make provision for a successor to be appointed by the Standing Committee to serve the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

Section 44.3 *Members*

Members of the Ecclesiastical Trial CourtDisciplinary Board shall be divided into three classes and elected on nomination of the Bishop at the Annual Council of the Diocese. The composition of each class shall be as follows:

Class 1 shall be composed of two Priests or Deacons and one qualified lay person;

Class 2 shall be composed of one Priest or Deacon and one qualified lay person; and

Class 3 shall be composed of one Priest or Deacon and one qualified lay person.

At the Annual Council of the Diocese held in 1996,2011, the members of all classes shall be elected on nomination of the Bishop for the following terms:

Class 1 - 3 years Class 2 - 2 years Class 3 - 1 year

In each subsequent Annual Council, the member or members of each class whose terms expire shall be elected for a three-year term. No member of the Ecclesiastical Trial CourtDisciplinary Board who has served a full three-year term shall succeed himself or herself after the expiration of his or her full term, but he or she shall be eligible for reelection after the lapse of one year from the expiration of such full term.

Section 44.4 *Vacancy*

The death, disability rendering a person unable to act, termination of canonical residence in the Diocese, termination of place of abode within this Diocese, or Renunciation of Ministry in the case of a Priest or Deacon, <u>or</u> resignation or declination (after election) to serve as a member of an Ecclesiastical Trial Court, the Disciplinary Board shall constitute a vacancy on the CourtBoard.

Section 44.5 *Notice*

Notice of resignations, declinations to serve, or renunciation shall be given by members of the CourtDisciplinary Board in writing to the Presiding JudgePresident of the CourtBoard.

Section 44.6 *Election to the Episcopate or Ordination*

If any Priest elected to the Ecclesiastical Trial CourtDisciplinary Board is elected a Bishop, or if any lay person elected to the Ecclesiastical Trial CourtDisciplinary Board is ordained, that person shall immediately cease to be a member of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court.Board. If either event occurs following the commencement of a Trialwhen the person is serving on a Hearing Panel and proceedings before the Hearing Panel have begun, the person shall continue to serve until the completion of the Trialproceedings and the rendering of a Verdict thereonissuance of an Order.

Section 44.7 *Filling a Vacancy*

Vacancies occurring in the Ecclesiastical Trial CourtDisciplinary Board, other than for cause under Section 8 of this Canon, shall be filled by a <u>qualified</u> person from the same order elected by the voteon nomination of a<u>the Bishop by</u> majority <u>vote</u> of the persons present at the Annual Council meeting immediately following the date on which the vacancy occurred. The person so elected shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person whose vacancy he or she fills and shall be eligible for reelection when such term expires. A vacancy may be filled temporarily until the next Annual Council by a qualified person of the same order elected on nomination of the Bishop₇ by majority vote of the persons present at a regular or special meeting of the Executive Board following the creation of the vacancy.

Section 44.8 *Challenges*

A member of the Ecclesiastical Trial Courta Conference Panel or Hearing Panel, or person elected appointed to serve in the place of such member under this Section 8, may be challenged by either the Respondent or the Church Attorney for cause stated to the Court. In addition, the Respondent and the Church Attorney shall each have one peremptory challenge which may be used against a member of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court, or person elected to serve in the place of such member under this Section 8. Vacancies caused by challenges shall be filled by majority vote of the Court from persons otherwise qualified for election under the Canons of the Diocese and such person shall serve until the completion of the Trial and the rendering of a Verdict thereon. Following such Verdict, the member challenged shall resume his or her duties as a member of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court. Vacancies filled by the Court shall be conflict of interest or undue bias by motion made to the Panel for disgualification of the challenged member. The members of the Panel not the subject of the challenge shall promptly consider the motion and determine whether the challenged Panel member shall be disgualified from participating in that proceeding. The President of the Disciplinary Board shall fill any vacancies on any Conference Panel or Hearing Panel caused by challenges with another member of the Board from the same order as the person challenged was when first elected to the Court. The Trial Court. In the event there is no remaining member of the Board from the same order to fill a vacancy on a Conference Panel or a Hearing Panel, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, may appoint a person from the same order qualified to serve on the Disciplinary Board to fill the vacancy. Such person shall serve on the Panel in guestion only until the completion of the proceedings before the Panel. The Board may establish rules consistent with this Canon for considering and acting upon such challenges.

Section 44.9 Federal Rules of Civil Procedure

The Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall be governed by the portion of The Federal Rules of Civil Procedure set forth in Appendix A to these Canons, and any amendment of such Appendix as adopted by either the General Convention of the Episcopal Church or the Episcopal Diocese of Texas.

Section 44.9 Intake Officer

<u>The Intake Officer shall be a Priest or Deacon or adult confirmed</u> communicant in good standing of the Church in the Diocese appointed from time to time by the Bishop after consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board. The Bishop may appoint one or more Intake Officers according to the needs of the Diocese. The Bishop shall publish the name and contact information of each Intake Officer throughout the Diocese.

Section 44.10 Federal Rules of Evidence

The Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall be governed by The Federal Rules of Evidence as applied in criminal cases in the conduct of the Trial.

Section 44.10 Investigator

<u>The Bishop shall appoint one or more Investigators in consultation with</u> <u>the President of the Disciplinary Board.</u> Each Investigator may, but need <u>not, be a member of the Church.</u>

Section 44.11 Advisors

In each proceeding under Title IV, the Bishop shall appoint an Advisor for the Complainant and an Advisor for the Respondent. Persons serving as Advisors shall hold no other appointed or elected position provided for under this Canon, and shall not include Chancellors or Vice-Chancellors of this Diocese or any person likely to be called as a witness in the proceeding.

Section 44.12 Reporter

The Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall appoint a Reporter who shall provide for the recording of the proceedings and who shall serve at the pleasure of the Court.

Section 44.12 Church Attorney

<u>Within two months after each Annual Diocesan Council, the Bishop, in</u> consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board, shall appoint a Church Attorney to serve for a term of one year and until his or her successor is duly appointed and qualified. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Church Attorney, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, shall appoint a successor to serve the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office. The Bishop may remove the Church Attorney for any good and sufficient reason, as determined in the Bishop's sole judgment. If, in any particular proceeding, the Church Attorney is unable to represent the Church for any reason, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, may appoint a substitute Church Attorney for that particular proceeding. The Church Attorney and any successor or substitute must be an adult confirmed communicant in good standing of the Church in this Diocese and a duly licensed attorney.

Section 44.13 Lay Assessors

The Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall appoint at least one but no more than three Lay Assessors. Lay Assessors shall have no vote. It shall be their duty to give the Ecclesiastical Trial Court an opinion on any question of law, procedure, or evidence, but not on any question of doctrine, upon which the Court or any member thereof, or either party, shall desire an opinion. Any question of whether a question is a matter of doctrine shall be decided by the Court by a majority vote.

Section 44.11 44.13 Clerk, and Assistant Clerks

The Ecclesiastical Trial CourtDisciplinary Board shall appoint a Clerk and, if necessary, Assistant Clerks, who shall be Priests or Deaconsto assist the Board with records management and administrative support. Each Clerk shall be a Priest or Deacon or adult confirmed communicantscommunicant in good standing of the Church in the Diocese, and who shall serve at the pleasure of the CourtBoard. The Clerk and any Assistant Clerk may be a member of the Board.

Section 44.14 Records

The Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall keep a record of the proceedings in each case brought before it and the record shall be certified by the Presiding Judge of the Court. If the record cannot be authenticated by the Presiding Judge by reason of the Presiding Judge's death, disability, or absence, it shall be authenticated by a member of the Court designated for that purpose by majority vote of the Court.

Section 44.15 Counsel for the Respondent

The Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall permit the Respondent to be heard in person and by counsel of the Respondent's own selection. In every Trial

the Court may regulate the number of counsel who may address the Court or examine witnesses.

Section 44.16 Respondent Pleas

The Respondent shall then be called upon by the Court to plead to the Presentment and the plea shall be duly recorded, and on neglect or refusal of the Respondent to plead, the plea of not guilty shall be entered for the Respondent, and the Trial shall proceed; *Provided*, that for sufficient cause the Court may adjourn from time to time; and *Provided also*, that the Respondent shall, at all times during the Trial, have liberty to be present, and in due time and order to produce testimony and to make a defense.

Section 44.17 Church Attorney, Complainant, and Victim

In all Ecclesiastical Trials, the Church Attorney appointed pursuant to Section 2 of this Canon shall appear on behalf of the Standing Committee which shall then be considered the party on one side and Respondent the party on the other. Unless prohibited under the Federal Rules of Evidence, each Complainant and Victim shall be entitled to be present throughout and observe the Trial and for each to be accompanied by a person of their own choosing and counsel of their own choosing.

Section 44.18 Instructions and Charge

Before a vote is taken on the findings and in the presence of the Respondent and counsel, counsel for the parties may submit requested proposed instructions. The Presiding Judge of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court, after consultation with the Lay Assessors, shall declare which of the proposed instructions shall be issued and also instruct the members of the Court as to the elements of the Offense and charge them (i) that the Respondent must be presumed to be innocent until the Respondent's guilt is established by clear and convincing evidence, and unless such standard of proof be met the Respondent must be acquitted, and (ii) that the burden of proof to establish the guilt of the Respondent is upon the Church Attorney.

Section 44.19 Vote

A separate vote shall be taken first upon the findings as to the guilt of the Respondent.

Section 44.20 Ballot

Voting by members of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court on the findings shall be by ballot. No member shall disclose his or her vote or the vote of any member.

Section 44.21 Two-thirds Vote

(a) For a Judgment on an Offense involving Crime, Immorality, or Conduct Unbecoming a Member of the Clergy, the affirmative vote of twothirds of the members of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall be necessary, and (b) For a Judgment on any other offense not involving Crime, Immorality, or Conduct Unbecoming a Member of the Clergy, the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall be necessary.

Section 44.22 Findings of the Court

The Presiding Judge shall cause the Respondent, the Church Attorney, each Complainant, and unless waived in writing, the Victim to be advised of and provided with a copy of the findings of the Court.

Section 44.23 Matters in Excuse or Mitigation

No vote shall be taken on the Sentence to be adjudged until thirty days from the date the Respondent was advised of the Judgment during which period the Respondent shall have a reasonable opportunity to offer to the Court matters in excuse or mitigation.

Section 44.24 Statements of the Complainants or Victims

During the same period, the Court shall provide an opportunity for statements from Complainants or Victims to the Court pertaining to the Sentence to be adjudged and imposed.

Section 44.25 Recommendation of the Church Attorney, Vote

During the same period, the Church Attorney may make a recommendation to the Court as to the Sentence to be adjudged. The members of the Court shall vote upon the Sentence. No member shall disclose his or her vote or the vote of any member.

Section 44.26 Two-thirds Vote to Adjudge and Impose a Sentence

The concurrence of two-thirds of the members of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court shall be necessary to adjudge and impose a Sentence upon a Respondent found guilty by the Court.

Section 44.27 Communication of the Judgment or Acquittal and Sentence

The Judgment or acquittal and any Sentence adjudged on a Judgment shall be communicated promptly to the Bishop, the Ecclesiastical Authority, if there be no Bishop, the Standing Committee, the Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese in which the Respondent is canonically resident, the Respondent, each Complainant, and, unless waived in writing, the Victim.

Section 44.28 Notice and Appeal

The Bishop or Ecclesiastical Authority, if there be no Bishop, shall cause written notice to be served on the Respondent, the Church Attorney, each Complainant, and unless waived in writing, the Victim of (i) the Judgment, (ii) the Sentence adjudged, and (iii) the Sentence to be pronounced by the Bishop. Within thirty days after the service of that notice, the Respondent may appeal to the Court of Review by serving a written notice of appeal on the Bishop, or upon the Ecclesiastical Authority, if there be no Bishop, and a copy on the Presiding Judge of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court and the Presiding Judge of the Court of Review. The notice shall be signed by the Respondent or the Respondent's counsel and shall briefly set forth the decision from which the appeal is taken and the grounds of the appeal.

Section 44.29 Pronouncement of Sentence

After Judgment by an Ecclesiastical Trial Court, the Bishop shall not pronounce Sentence on the Respondent before the expiration of thirty days after the Respondent shall have been served as set forth in Section 28 with the notice of the decision of the Court and the Sentence adjudged, not, in case an appeal is taken, shall Sentence be pronounced pending the hearing and final determination thereof.

Section 44.30 44.14 Conflict

Should any provision of this Canon conflict with Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church, the latter shall prevail.

Section 44.31 44.15 Expenses of the Diocese

Any legal fees and other disbursements of The reasonable costs and expenses of the Disciplinary Board, the Intake Officer, the Investigator, the Church Attorney, the Advisors, and the Clerk shall be the responsibility of this Diocese, unless the Trial was held as a service or convenience to another Diocese from which the Presentment issued, in which case the responsibility therefor shall be that of the Diocese from which the Presentment was issued. . Any legal fees and costcosts incurred by the Respondent shall be the responsibility of the Respondent. In the event of a final Order dismissing the complaint, the reasonable legal fees and costs incurred by the Respondent may, in the Bishop's sole discretion, be reimbursed by the Diocese. The record of proceedings of the Diocese Ecclesiastical Trial CourtBoard shall be the expense of the Diocese. Expenses of the Diocese relating to the Ecclesiastical Trial Court disciplinary proceedings under Title IV shall be deemed to be necessary and proper expenses of the Diocese and shall be included in the assessment budget.

[Federal Rules of Civil Procedure as modified and adopted for use in the administration of Title IV, The Canons of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the United States and the Episcopal Diocese of Texas.]

APPENDIX A TO CANON 44

Rule 4. Summons

(a) Form. The summons shall be signed by the clerk, identify the Court and the parties, be directed to the accused and state the name and address of the Church Advocate. It shall state the time within which the accused must appear and defend, and notify the accused that failure to do so will result in a judgment of guilt and place the accused at risk for a sentence to be pronounced at a later date. The court may allow a summons to be amended.

(c) Service with Complaint (Presentment); by Whom Made

(1) A summons may be made by a person who is not a direct party and who is at least 18 years of age.

(d) Waiver of Service; Duty to Save Costs of Service; Request to Waive.

[The provisions of FRCP 4(d) shall apply noting that the "Plaintiff" shall be the Church as represented by the Church Advocate; the "Defendant" shall be the accused; and the "Complaint" shall be the Presentment.] (e) Service Upon Individuals Within a Judicial District of the United States.

[The provisions of FRCP 4(e) shall apply noting that service may be made upon individuals in any territorial area wherein Episcopal jurisdiction of this Church is recognized.]

(I) Proof of Service. If service is not waived, the person effecting service shall make proof thereof by affidavit or sworn statement to the court.

- Rule 6. Time [FRCP 6, as written.]
- Rule 8. General Rule of Pleadings [FRCP 8, as written.]
- Rule 10. Form of Pleadings [FRCP 10, as written, deleting the file number and its designation.]

PROPOSED NEW CANON

Canon 49 PASTORAL CARE

Section 1: Clergy in this diocese shall be permitted to offer and to officiate at a prayer service for couples making commitment to one another, to God, and to the Church for whom a registration of marriage with the State may incur extraordinarily punitive consequences or for whom the sacrament of Holy Matrimony is canonically inaccessible.

Section 2: Clergy shall provide pastoral care, discernment, and spiritual formation in preparation for the use of such service of prayer.

Section 3: No clergy shall be required to officiate at any such service of prayer.

Section 4: Clergy shall respect and express the Church's teaching that Holy Matrimony is the desired norm for Christian couples making commitment to one another, to God, and to the Church.

Janet Jones, chair of the Committee on Nominations, began the presentation of the report of that committee by placing in nomination the name of Robert J. Biehl for

Treasurer of the Diocese. There being no further nominations, it was moved and adopted by applause that Mr. Biehl be elected by acclamation.

The Committee placed in nomination for Secretary of the Diocese, the name of John A. Logan, Jr. There being no further nominations, the motion was made and adopted with applause that Canon Logan be elected by acclamation.

Nominated by the Committee for the Standing Committee (lay order) were Thomas G. Gebhard, Jr., John Hancock, Andrew Lyon, Dorothy B. Miller, and Chester T. Scheel. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for the Standing Committee (clergy order) were Jeff W. Fisher, Desmond Goonesekera, Genevieve Razim, and James V. Stockton. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for the Executive Board (lay order) were Mark O. Duncan, Ann Foxworth, Kathryn Harriss, Kenneth F. Hoffman, S. Wayne Mathis, Cornelius D. Perry, David R. Reeves, Robert B. Sterk, Shelly S. Vitanza, and John Bennet Waters. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for the Executive Board (clergy order) were Howard Castleberry, Daryl T. Hay, Lisa S. Hines, Lisa W. Hunt, James C. Nelson, Andrew Parker, and F. Stuart Shelby. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for delegates to Provincial Synod (lay) were David A. Bollinger, James S. Cowan, Elizabeth Dowell, Jacqueline L. Frahm, Don McManus, Alyssa Stebbing, Carroll Tucker, and Kathryn G. Whaley. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for delegates to Provincial Synod (clergy) were Bob Bliss, Jeff W. Fisher, Patrick McK. Hall, Eric Hungerford, Bobbie Knowles, Beth Magill, Alex Montes-Vela, John B. St. Romain, and Stephen F. Whaley. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for deputies to General Convention (lay) were Clint B. Capers, Laurie R. Eiserloh, Thomas C. Fitzhugh, Kerry K. Hancock, David Harvin, Ora Houston, Sandra M. Kelley, Muffie Moroney, Mary F. Parmer, Cornelius D. Perry,

Elizabeth B. Smith, and Trey Yarbrough. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for deputies to General Convention (clergy) were Susan J. Barnes, David A. Boyd, Mark T. Crawford, Janet W. Dantone, Frank E. Fuller, Susan Kennard, Justin A. Lindstrom, Patrick Miller, Joe D. Reynolds, Jim Stockton, and Chuck Treadwell. Nominated from the floor were Chris Bowhay and Uriel Osnaya-Jimenez. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for trustee of the Church Corporation were Charles Hall and Eugene Sepulveda. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

Nominated by the Committee for trustee of the University of the South were Richard T. Houser III, Robert Moore, and Chuck Treadwell. There were no further nominations, and nominations were closed.

The motion was made and adopted that the nominations slate as proposed by the Nominations Committee and as amended from the floor be accepted. The election procedure was explained, and the first ballot was taken.

Following announcements, the Bishop declared a fifteen-minute recess. When Council reconvened, Bob Biehl, treasurer, presented the 2009 financial report of the diocese. It was announced that, as a result of an increasing number of congregations meeting their assessments, the diocese was able to retire its line of credit and owed nothing by December 31, 2010. The Insurance Budget ended the year with a surplus. Every major category of expense was under budget in 2010.

For the Finance Committee, John Bennet Waters presented the 2011 Diocesan Assessment Budget (Part A – Insurance; Part B – Diocesan Operations). The 2011 Diocesan Assessment Budget, Part A of \$4,753,000 (Insurance Budget) and Part B of \$5,071,030 (Diocesan Operations Budget) for a total budget of \$9,824,030.00 were then moved and adopted on a voice vote without discussion.

The recommended 2011 Missionary Budget (as revised in the version distributed on the floor of Council as a result of receipts received in December) of \$2,152,900 (a decrease from 2010 of \$418,000, contributing to a two-year decrease of almost \$1M) was presented and moved for adoption. The budget was adopted on a voice vote. It

was announced that the Audit Committee had received "clean" audit reports for all diocesan entities and foundations for 2010.

Bert Baetz, chair of the Committee on Resolutions, outlined the process behind the Committee's report. Resolution #1 was then presented.

RESOLUTION #1

A Resolution on the Role of the Church in a Time of Public Fear and Scarcity

Whereas in this time of economic and geopolitical uncertainty, fear threatens to separate the children of God from one another;

Whereas fear has led to disrespectful public discourse as well as scapegoating, bullying and hate crimes in response to actual, or perceived, differences including those of race, skin color, religion, national origin; sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, disability or immigration status, among others;

Whereas Jesus advocated on behalf of the outcasts of his day. He invited everyone to sit at the table and break bread with Him;

Whereas our congregations benefit from the talents, resources, leadership and unselfish gifts of all sorts and conditions of humanity;

Therefore, be it resolved that the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas invites every congregation, and every individual, actively to cultivate an ethic of love for all God's children;

Be it further resolved that congregations are encouraged to develop and model the capacity for respectful conversation among those of differing identities and views;

Be it further resolved, that institutions of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas be safe and supportive places for all people including young people;

Be it further resolved that the Episcopal Diocese of Texas denounces bullying, scapegoating, hate crimes and other manifestations of fear;

Be it further resolved, that the Episcopal Diocese of Texas shall publicly support legislative efforts to preserve human dignity.

Rationale: This resolution makes a public statement about our baptismal vows in relation to our actions in the church and the world. Today, the people of God face significant challenges. These include: economic instability, unemployment, terrorism, war and ecological degradation. In response to these challenges, we are tempted to turn inward and to lash out at others. We forget that Jesus calls us to be in community with one another, to strive for justice and peace and to respect the dignity of every human being. In these difficult times, the church is in a unique position to lead: to offer refuge and to advocate on behalf of people who are marginalized and hopeless. Drawing upon our Anglican heritage of unity in the midst of diversity, the church provides a forum for healing and reconciliation.

was then adopted on a voice vote.

The Committee then presented the following resolution:

RESOLUTION #2

Resolution Regarding the Sin of Bullying

Whereas the suicide rate among teenagers in this country is known to be tragically high, and

Whereas the suicide rate among gay teenagers and gay-perceived teenagers is well established to be three to four times higher than non-gay; and

Whereas obedience to the teachings of Jesus Christ disallow the bullying of teenagers at all, much more so to the point that they would take their lives; and

Whereas the people of the Diocese of Texas are grieved that so many teenagers who are gay or perceived to be gay have been bullied and have committed suicide, including within the area of our own diocese; and

Whereas our baptismal covenant includes a vow to strive for justice and peace among all people and to respect the dignity of every human being;

Be it resolved that the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas calls on the Executive Board of this diocese to issue a press release in thirty days condemning the bullying of any child, straight, gay, or perceived to be gay; and be it further

Resolved that the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas calls on the Executive Board to communicate with State and Federal legislators whose constituencies reside within the diocese to express and urge support of anti-bullying legislation; and be it further

Resolved that the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas encourages all the people of the diocese, clergy and lay, to communicate with their State and Federal legislators to express and urge support of anti-bullying legislation; and be it further

Resolved that the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas encourages all the people of the diocese, clergy and lay, to support in prayer, in word, and in deed, the efforts of school systems, public and private, to implement anti-bullying programs that educate students regarding the dangers and sin of bullying.

Submitted by Andy Lyon, lay delegate, the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection, Austin.

The Committee on Resolutions does not recommend this resolution for adoption. The Committee on Resolutions believes this resolution is encompassed in the first resolution.

The resolution was then moved and seconded from the Council floor. The mover of the resolution accepted as a friendly amendment, the words "in principle" in the second and third Resolved ("urge support … <u>in principle</u>"). Lengthy discussion followed. The Question was moved, seconded, and adopted by a 2/3 voice vote. The original motion was then not adopted.

The Committee then presented the resolutions #3a-#3f regarding Criminal Justice:

Resolution #3a

Whereas, Christ came into the world to transform human beings and Scripture calls upon Christians to respect the dignity of every person; be it,

Resolved, that the 162nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas recommit itself to the Biblical call to forgive those who have offended the law and paid their debt to society and grant them the second chance that Christ offers them recognizing the power of God to transform and in this way, we proclaim release to the captives and set the prisoners free.

The Committee recommended and moved the adoption of this resolution. The resolution was adopted on a voice vote.

The Committee then continued with the following resolution:

Resolution #3b

Whereas, the teachings of the *Old* and *New Testaments* repeatedly call upon the people to fairly apply God's Justice; be it

Resolved by the 162nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, that justice be recognized as a goal not just for offenders, but most importantly for victims and the community harmed by crime alike. Submitted by: The Reverend James C. Morgan, St. Stephen's, Huntsville; the Reverend Joseph Mills, Grace Episcopal, Alvin; and Dr. Edwin S. Davis, St. Stephen's, Huntsville.

The Committee recommended and moved the adoption of this resolution. The resolution was then adopted on a voice vote.

The Committee then presented the following resolution:

Resolution #3c

Whereas, the state recognizes that incarceration is not the solution to all law-breaking; be it

Resolved, that the 162nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas calls for alternatives to prison for first-time non-violent offenders which make them aware of the harm they have done to others and require accountability, restitution and community service.

Comment: This proposal is in harmony with Resolution C010 (2000), 73rd General Convention.

Submitted by: The Reverend James C. Morgan, St. Stephen's, Huntsville; the Reverend Joseph Mills, Grace Episcopal, Alvin; and Dr. Edwin S. Davis, St. Stephen's, Huntsville.

The Committee recommended and moved the adoption of this resolution. The resolution was then adopted on a voice vote.

The Committee then presented the following resolution:

Resolution #3d

Whereas, there is much missionary activity engaged in by our people in our parishes and missions that could be replicated in other "missionary outposts" if the people were made aware of the need and the means to do this work; be it

Resolved, that The Episcopal Diocese of Texas request parishes and missions report such activities to the Diocese for the edification of the whole Church; and be it further

Resolved, that the Diocese extends thanks to the many ministries of the church, including those who feed the poor, pray for the sick, clothe the naked, visit the prisoners, mentor to children, provide shelter to the homeless and do other good work.

Submitted by: The Reverend James C. Morgan, St. Stephen's, Huntsville; the Reverend Joseph Mills, Grace Episcopal, Alvin; and Dr. Edwin S. Davis, St. Stephen's, Huntsville.

The Committee recommended and moved the adoption of this resolution. The resolution was then adopted on a voice vote.

The Committee on Supervisors and Tellers presented the results of the first ballot. The results of the first ballot votes for Standing Committee, lay, were Thomas Gebhard 194, John Hancock 246, Andrew Lyon 60, Dorothy Miller 76, and Chester Scheel 95 There would be a run-off between Thomas Gebhard and John Hancock for the lay position on the Standing Committee.

The results of the first ballot votes for Standing Committee, clergy, were Jeff Fisher 234, Desmond Goonesekera 202, Genevieve Razim 189, and James Stockton 59. There would be a run-off between Jeff Fisher and Desmond Goonesekera for the clergy position on the Standing Committee.

The results of the first ballot votes for the Executive Board, lay, were Mark Duncan 267, Ann Foxworth 125, Kathryn Harriss 99, Kenneth Hoffman 142, Wayne Mathis 100, Cornelius Perry 170, David Reeves 241, Robert Sterk, 154, Shelly Vitanza 282, and John Bennet Waters 284. There would be a run-off between Mark Duncan, Cornelius Perry, David Reeves, Robert Sterk, Shelly Vitanza, and John Bennet Waters for the three lay positions on the Executive Board.

The results of the first ballot votes for the Executive Board, clergy, were Howard Castleberry 234, Daryl Hay 191, Lisa Hines 218, Lisa Hunt, 161, James Nelson 137, Andrew Parker 130, and Stuart Shelby 239. There would be a run-off for the two clergy positions on the Executive Board between Howard Castleberry, Daryl Hay, Lisa Hines, and Stuart Shelby.

For trustee of the Church Corporation, the results were Charles Hall 402 votes and Eugene Sepulveda 245 votes. Elected as trustee of the Church Corporation was Charles Hall.

For trustee of the University of the South, the results were Richard Houser 80 votes, Robert Moore 121 votes, and Chuck Treadwell 456 votes. Elected as trustee of the University of the South was Chuck Treadwell.

The results of the first ballot votes for General Convention clergy deputy were Susan Barnes 196, David Boyd 198, Mark Crawford 349, Janet Dantone 218, Frank Fuller 214,

Susan Kennard 276, Justin Lindstrom 150, Patrick Miller 200, Joe Reynolds 207, Jim Stockton 88, Chuck Treadwell 278, Chris Bowhay 143, and Uriel Osnaya-Jimenez 94.

Elected as General Convention clergy deputy was Mark Crawford. There would be a run-off for the remaining three deputy positions between Janet Dantone, Frank Fuller, Susan Kennard, Patrick Miller, Joe Reynolds, and Chuck Treadwell.

The results of first ballot votes for General Convention lay deputy were Clint Capers 163, Laurie Eiserloh 204, Thomas Fitzhugh 160, Kerry Hancock 280, David Harvin 279, Ora Houston 252, Sandra Kelly 109, Muffie Moroney 109, Mary Parmer 223, Cornelius Perry 157, Elizabeth Smith 179, and Trey Yarbrough 326.

Elected as General Convention lay deputy was Trey Yarbrough. There would be a run-off for the remaining three deputy positions between Laurie Eiserloh, Kerry Hancock, David Harvin, Ora Houston, Mary Parmer, and Elizabeth Smith.

The results of the first ballot votes for lay delegate to Provincial Synod were David Bollinger 395, James Cowan 202, Elizabeth Dowell 243, Jacqueline Frahm 151, Don McManus 213, Alyssa Stebbing 348, Carroll Tucker 232, and Kathryn Whaley 348.

Elected as lay delegates to Provincial Synod were David Bollinger, Alyssa Stebbing, and Kathryn Whaley. There would be a run-off for the remaining position between Elizabeth Dowell and Carroll Tucker.

The result of first ballot votes for clergy delegate to the Provincial Synod were Bob Bliss 180, Jeff Fisher 324, Patrick Hall 277, Eric Hungerford 333, Bobbie Knowles 278, Beth Magill 262, Alex Montes-Vela 305, Brad St. Romain 130, and Stephen Whaley 288.

Elected as clergy delegates to Provincial Synod were Jeff Fisher, Eric Hungerford, Alex Montes-Vela, and Stephen Whaley. Clergy Alternates would be Bob Bliss, Patrick Hall, Bobbie Knowles, and Beth Magill.

Following a prayer by the Chaplain, ballot number two was taken. The Chaplain then led Noonday Prayers and prayers for those lay and clergy who had served the diocese in years past and had departed this life since 161st Council (the complete list may be found elsewhere in this *Journal*).

The Bishop declared a recess for lunch.

SECOND SESSION

February 13, 2011

When Council reconvened, the Bishop asked for unanimous consent to move to mode "B" in the Special Rules of Procedure (twenty minutes on any one issue, two minutes on any one speech). There was no objection.

Reporting on the second ballot, it was announced that for the Standing Committee, lay, John Hancock had received 377 votes, Thomas Gebhard 265. John Hancock was elected to the lay position on the Standing Committee. On the second ballot for Standing Committee, clergy, Jeff Fisher had received 375 votes and Desmond Goonesekera 272 votes. Elected to the Standing Committee, clergy position, was Jeff Fisher.

On the second ballot for Executive Board, lay, Mark Duncan received 341 votes, Cornelius Perry 259 votes, David Reeves 298 votes, Robert Sterk 178 votes, Shelly Vitanza 379 votes, and John Bennet Waters 346 votes. Elected to the three lay positions on the Executive Board were Mark Duncan, Shelly Vitanza, and John Bennet Waters.

On the second ballot for Executive Board, clergy, Howard Castleberry received 311 votes, Daryl Hay 257 votes, Lisa Hines 330 votes, and Stuart Shelby 335 votes. Elected to the two clergy positions were Lisa Hines and Stuart Shelby.

On the second ballot for General Convention deputy, clergy, Janet Dantone received 267 votes, Frank Fuller 248, Susan Kennard 398, Patrick Miller 281, Joe Reynolds 246, and Chuck Treadwell 425. Elected as clergy deputies to General Convention were Susan Kennard and Chuck Treadwell. There would a run-off for the remaining two clergy deputy positions between Janet Dantone and Patrick Miller.

On the second ballot for General Convention deputy, lay, Laurie Eiserloh received 263 votes, Kerry Hancock 371, David Harvin 325, Ora Houston 321, Mary Parmer 319, and Elizabeth Smith 303. Elected to the three remaining positions as lay deputies to General Convention were Kerry Hancock, David Harvin, and Ora Houston (Trey Yarbrough having been elected on the first ballot). Lay alternates would be Clint Capers, Laurie Eiserloh, Mary Parmer, and Elizabeth Smith.

On the second ballot for Provincial Synod delegate, lay, Elizabeth Dowell received 306 votes and Carroll Tucker 317. Carroll Tucker was elected as fourth delegate. Elected earlier as lay delegates to Provincial Synod were David Bollinger, Alyssa Stebbing, and Kathryn Whaley. Lay alternates for Provincial Synod will be James Cowan, Elizabeth Dowell, Jacqueline Frahm, and Don McManus.

The Chaplain led the Council in prayer before the ballots were cast. Ballot number three was then taken.

Returning to the report of the Committee on Resolutions, the Committee presented the following resolution by title:

Resolution #3e

Whereas, our children, next to the Word of God, are our most precious resource; be it

Resolved, that The Episcopal Diocese of Texas urges the national church to call a conference to share knowledge among the dioceses conducting camps for children of the incarcerated and to invite all nonparticipating dioceses to explore the possibility of offering similar opportunities to the highest at-risk population (for incarceration) in the United States.

Comment: This proposal is in harmony with Resolution D012 (2006), 75th General Convention.

Submitted by: The Reverend James C. Morgan, St. Stephen's, Huntsville; the Reverend Joseph Mills, Grace Episcopal, Alvin; and Dr. Edwin S. Davis, St. Stephen's, Huntsville.

The Committee recommended and moved the adoption of this resolution. Hearing no objection, the Bishop declared the resolution adopted.

The Committee then presented the following resolution:

Resolution #3f

Whereas, The Episcopal Church of the United States passed Resolution 2003-A125 (Ministry to Prisoners and their Families); be it

Resolved, that The Episcopal Diocese of Texas, respond to the resolution, which, "urged dioceses and congregations to become familiar with the criminal justice system and form ministries which assist prisoners and their families" following arrest, during trial and incarceration, and during their post release readjustment period; "to support the establishment of and/or expansion of occupational, therapeutic treatment,

and academic programs in prison where prisoners may be prepared for reentry into society; and, be it further

Resolved, that the parishes and missions of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas be firmly committed to a system of justice that seeks to provide the victims and the perpetrators with rehabilitative services so that healing may take place and citizens can live in peace; and, be it further

Resolved, that to aid in reentry, the Texas Department of Criminal Justice house inmates as close to their family and loved ones as possible and institute programs of its own or with approved volunteers to strengthen positive family relationships and prepare all for harmonious living upon release.

Comment: This proposed resolution is in harmony with Resolutions B-055 (2000), 73rd General Convention and, A-125 (2003), 74th General Convention.

The Standing Commission on National Concerns heard eloquent testimony concerning the need for rehabilitation programs for prisoners, so that they can successfully reintegrate into their communities. It noted that, according to Bureau of Justice reports, approximately 650,000 state and federal prisoners reenter society each year; but about half of all former prisoners are returned to prison for a new crime or parole violation within three years. While, what are called, "reentry" programs offer employment training, mental health and substance abuse treatment, behavior modification and family assistance classes, it is clear that security concerns trump investment in rehabilitation. The states and federal governments need help. Volunteers are that help. The Commission believes that to truly "set the prisoners free," programs must be provided during the time prisoners are incarcerated to give them hope for a better future and the skills necessary to succeed before they are released. Programs such as "Amicus" in Minnesota, Kairos throughout the United States and Bridges to Life in Texas offer examples of such efforts. The Church is the source of the majority of these volunteers.

The 74th General Convention concurred in Resolution 2003-A125 ("Ministry to Prisoners and their Families"), in which the Convention "urged dioceses and congregations to become familiar with the criminal justice system and form ministries which assist prisoners and their families during sentencing, while in prison and during their readjustment period; to support the establishment of and/or expansion of occupational, therapeutic treatment, and academic programs in prison where prisoners may be prepared for re-entry into society."

The Committee recommended and moved the adoption of this resolution. Hearing no objection, the Bishop declared the resolution adopted.

The Committee then presented the following resolution:

Resolution #4

WHEREAS, the Episcopal Diocese of Texas is a leader in the area of mission and evangelism to colleges and universities; and

WHEREAS, the College Missioners' Association of the Diocese of Texas and parishes involved in this mission affirm the need to expand this mission to community colleges;

BE IT RESOLVED, that this 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas submit the following resolution to the 77th General Convention of The Episcopal Church:

WHEREAS, the House of Deputies concurring, the 77th General Convention of The Episcopal Church reaffirm our commitment to the Episcopal Church Strategic Planning Survey Report's statement that "The Church needs to see campus ministry and young adult ministry as the most important evangelism and mission area there is. It is where our culture is the most dynamic, most committed, most culturally diverse"; and

WHEREAS, The Episcopal Church recognize the increasing importance of community colleges as critical places for evangelism and Christian formation, particularly among racially, ethnically, and socioeconomically diverse populations;

BE IT RESOLVED, that to respond to this pastoral need, the General Convention support the creation of two new campus ministries at community colleges in each of the nine Provinces of the Episcopal Church, and provide training for local leaders of these mission initiatives; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Convention direct the Office of Young Adult & Campus Ministries at the Episcopal Church Center, in cooperation with the Provincial Coordinators for Campus Ministry, to oversee a process for application for and allocation of grants to fund these new missions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Convention request the Joint Standing Committee on Program, Budget, and Finance to consider a budget allocation of \$760,000 for the implementation of this resolution.

The Committee on Resolutions recommended and moved the adoption of this resolution. Hearing no objection, the Bishop declared the resolution adopted.

The Bishop introduced and presented gifts to the visiting bishops from Pakistan. The Right Reverend Humphrey Peters, Bishop of Peshawar, Church of Pakistan, and the Right Reverend Mano Rumalshah, retired Bishop of Peshawar. Bishop Peters spoke briefly to Council.

The Reverend John Newton, Canon for Lifelong Christian Formation, introduced Emily Martin-McKamie, member of the Christian Leadership Conference Steering Committee, who spoke briefly to Council.

Bishop Harrison spoke about the Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) "Nets for Life" campaign in the Diocese of Texas for 30,000 (the estimated number of household units in the Diocese of Texas) malaria nets. Rob Radke, President of ERD was introduced to speak to Council. A short movie about "Nets for Life" was shown.

Bishop Doyle introduced to Council, clergy new to the diocese since the 161st Council.

The report of the Constitution and Canons Committee was begun by the Chancellor in place of Maria Boyce with the presentation of the following amendment to Canon 9.

Canon 9 THE VESTRY

Section 9.1 Election at Parish Meetings

In each Parish shall be chosen from the qualified voters not less than three nor more than eighteen communicants to serve as members of the vestry. The number and the manner of electing the same shall be determined from time to time by the Parish at the annual Parish Meeting. The Parish Meeting at which the election takes place may be held no earlier than October 1st nor later than the annual Parish Meeting, as the vestry may determine, public notice of such election in any case to be given during the stated services the two (2) Sundays preceding; provided that, except to fill vacancies, the vestry members so elected shall not take office until the adjournment of the annual Parish Meeting, which shall be held on the first Monday in January or as soon thereafter as convenient, public notice of such annual Parish Meeting in any case to be given during the stated services the Sunday preceding.

(a) Regular members of the vestry shall be elected to serve for three years, and shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified, and their terms shall be so arranged that one-third shall go out of office each year. In new Parishes, when the Vestry is first

chosen, one-third of the Vestry shall be chosen for one year, one-third for two years, and one-third for three years, the full term thereafter to be three years.

(b) A Parish may decide to have one or two youth members of the vestry in addition to the regular members. Youth members of the vestry must meet all qualifications of vestry members specified in this Canon, except that they are required to be only 16 years of age. A Parish that chooses to have youth members of the vestry has the following options, to be determined from time to time by the Parish at the annual Parish Meeting:

(1) The term of office for youth members of a vestry may be for fewer than three years.

(2) The term of office for youth members of a vestry may begin at a date other than the adjournment of the annual Parish Meeting.

(3) Youth members of a vestry either (a) may have voice, but no vote or (b) may vote except when the vote involves issues where a person under the age of 18 does not have capacity under Texas law.

(c) No person shall serve as member of the Vestry until he or she shall have subscribed to the following declaration:

"I am persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain all doctrine required as necessary for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ; and I accede to the Doctrine, Discipline, and Worship of the Protestant Episcopal Church."

(d) In case a vacancy shall occur, the Vestry shall fill the vacancy until the next annual election by electing a communicant from the qualified voters of the Parish, and the Congregation shall then fill the unexpired term. Members of the Vestry chosen to fill unexpired terms, shall, like those elected for full terms, be communicants and qualified voters of the Parish.

(e) No retiring member of the Vestry elected by the Congregation for a full term, shall be eligible for re-election until a period of one year shall have elapsed, unless approved in writing by the Bishop.

Section 9.2 Persons Eligible to Vote – Definitions of Confirmed Communicant and Communicant in Good Standing

Men and women at least 16 years of age, who are enrolled confirmed communicants in good standing of the Parish, are entitled to vote for

members of the Vestry and upon all questions requiring the action of the Congregation, but none shall be admitted to serve as regular members of the Vestry except those who are at least 18 years of age. If a Parish determines to have them, youth members of a Vestry must be at least 16 years of age at the time their term begins. Voting may be by absentee ballot under such rules and regulations as may have been established at a prior Parish Meeting.

For the purpose of Canon 9.2, an enrolled communicant in good standing of a Parish is a communicant in good standing who is enrolled as such in the records of such Parish.

For purpose of the Canons, a confirmed communicant or confirmed communicant in good standing is a communicant or communicant in good standing who has been confirmed by a Bishop of the Episcopal Church or a Bishop of a Church in communion with the Episcopal Church or has been received into the Episcopal Church by a Bishop of the Episcopal Church.

For purpose of the Canons, a communicant in good standing is a communicant who for the previous year has been faithful in corporate worship, unless for good cause prevented, and has been faithful in working, praying, and giving for the spread of the Kingdom of God.

THE COMMITTEE <u>DOES NOT RECOMMEND</u> ADOPTION OF THIS PROPOSAL.

RATIONALE (The Committee):

Although the Committee strongly favors the involvement of youth in each Parish, the Committee does not agree that persons under 18 should be permitted to serve as voting Vestry members. First, each Vestry has serious legal responsibilities for the business affairs of a Parish, including decisions about finances, property acquisitions, construction and maintenance, and the calling of Rectors. Second, most Parishes are incorporated. Under the articles of incorporation and the bylaws of such Parishes, the board of directors of the corporation is the Vestry, which, in turn, serves as the legal agent of the Parish. However, under Texas law, persons under 18 cannot enter into a valid contract, which is contrary to the legal duties placed upon a Vestry. The Committee suggests that Parishioners younger than 18 could serve as *ex officio* members of a Vestry, which would address the legal concerns set forth above and would not require an amendment of Canon 9.

As the Committee did not recommend adoption, the proposed amendment to Canon 9 was moved from the floor and was seconded. Discussion followed. An amendment was moved and seconded to make the following change: To Section 9.1(b)(3) add the sentence "Youth members of a Vestry under 18 years of age may have voice but no vote." The amendment was seconded and brief discussion followed. The amendment was not adopted on a voice vote. On a voice vote, the main motion was then not adopted.

The results of the third ballot were announced for General Convention deputy. Patrick Miller received 353 votes and Janet Dantone 273. Patrick Miller was elected as the fourth deputy to General Convention. Alternates would be David Boyd, Janet Dantone, Frank Fuller, and Joe Reynolds.

The report of the Committee on Constitution and Canons continued with the presentation of the following amendment to Canon 43:

Canon 43 MORAL DISCIPLINE

All members of the clergy, having subscribed to the Declaration required by Article VIII of the Constitution of the Episcopal Church, shall be under obligation to model in their own lives the received teaching of the Church that all of its members are to abstain from sexual relations outside Holy Matrimony.

SUBMITTED BY: The Rev'd Jim Stockton, The Episcopal Church of the Resurrection, Austin.

RATIONALE (by Rev'd Stockton):

Holy Matrimony is one of the sacraments of the Church. By honored ancient tradition and under the polity of the Episcopal Church the sacraments are defined by Christ Jesus and by the whole Church for the whole Church. By honored ancient tradition and under the polity of the Episcopal Church a smaller constituent body of the Church does not define for itself the sacraments of the Church. This amendment relieves the Diocese of Texas of either seeming to or claiming to have the autonomous authority to define for itself one of the Church's sacraments. This amendment leaves the church-wide definition of the Church's sacrament of Holy Matrimony rightfully with the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church. This amendment respects the descriptions of the sacrament of Holy Matrimony as found in the Book of Common Prayer and in the Book of Occasional Services (e.g. "Anniversary of a Marriage" pp. 163ff).

THE COMMITTEE PRESENTS THIS PROPOSAL <u>WITHOUT</u> <u>RECOMMENDATION</u>.

The proposed amendment was moved from the floor and was seconded. Brief discussion followed. The motion was made and seconded to postpone consideration of the amendment indefinitely. Brief discussion followed. Following an inconclusive voice vote, the motion to postpone indefinitely was then adopted by a standing vote.

The Committee presented the following proposed new Canon 44:

Canon 44 DISCIPLINE

Section 44.1 Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church

In all matters of ecclesiastical discipline, effective July 1, 2011, the Diocese shall follow and be governed by Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church as adopted at General Convention in 2009, and as amended from time to time hereafter. Except as otherwise expressly provided or when the content otherwise requires, capitalized words as used in this Canon shall have the same meanings as those set forth in Title IV, Canon 2 of the Canons of the Episcopal Church. The predecessor to this Diocesan Canon shall stand repealed on July 1, 2011.

Section 44.2 Disciplinary Board

There shall be within and for the Diocese a Disciplinary Board consisting of seven members, four Priests or Deacons, whose actual residence and canonical residence is within this Diocese, and three lay adult confirmed communicants in good standing of the Church in this Diocese. A member of the Standing Committee may serve on the Disciplinary Board. Annually, within two months following each Annual Diocesan Council, the members of the Disciplinary Board shall elect a President from its members. The President shall serve for a term of one year and until his or her successor is hereby elected and qualified.

Section 44.3 *Members*

Members of the Disciplinary Board shall be divided into three classes and elected on nomination of the Bishop at the Annual Council of the Diocese. The composition of each class shall be as follows:

Class 1 shall be composed of two Priests or Deacons and one qualified lay person;

Class 2 shall be composed of one Priest or Deacon and one qualified lay person; and

Class 3 shall be composed of one Priest or Deacon and one qualified lay person.

At the Annual Council of the Diocese held in 2011, the members of all classes shall be elected on nomination of the Bishop for the following terms:

Class 1 - 3 years Class 2 - 2 years Class 3 - 1 year

In each subsequent Annual Council, the member or members of each class whose terms expire shall be elected for a three-year term. No member of the Disciplinary Board who has served a full three-year term shall succeed himself or herself after the expiration of his or her full term, but he or she shall be eligible for reelection after the lapse of one year from the expiration of such full term.

Section 44.4 Vacancy

The death, disability rendering a person unable to act, termination of canonical residence in the Diocese, termination of place of abode within this Diocese, Renunciation of Ministry in the case of a Priest or Deacon, or resignation or declination (after election) to serve as a member of the Disciplinary Board shall constitute a vacancy on the Board.

Section 44.5 Notice

Notice of resignations, declinations to serve, or renunciation shall be given by members of the Disciplinary Board in writing to the President of the Board.

Section 44.6 Election to the Episcopate or Ordination

If any Priest elected to the Disciplinary Board is elected a Bishop, or if any lay person elected to the Disciplinary Board is ordained, that person shall immediately cease to be a member of the Board. If either event occurs when the person is serving on a Hearing Panel and proceedings before the Hearing Panel have begun, the person shall continue to serve until the completion of the proceedings and the issuance of an Order.

Section 44.7 *Filling a Vacancy*

Vacancies occurring in the Disciplinary Board, other than for cause under Section 8 of this Canon, shall be filled by a qualified person from the same order elected on nomination of the Bishop by majority vote of the persons present at the Annual Council meeting immediately following the date on which the vacancy occurred. The person so elected shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person whose vacancy he or she fills and shall be eligible for reelection when such term expires. A vacancy may be filled temporarily until the next Annual Council by a qualified person of the same order elected on nomination of the Bishop by majority vote of the persons present at a regular or special meeting of the Executive Board following the creation of the vacancy.

Section 44.8 *Challenges*

A member of a Conference Panel or Hearing Panel, or person appointed to serve in the place of such member under this Section 8, may be challenged by either the Respondent or the Church Attorney for conflict of interest or undue bias by motion made to the Panel for disqualification of the challenged member. The members of the Panel not the subject of the challenge shall promptly consider the motion and determine whether the challenged Panel member shall be disgualified from participating in that The President of the Disciplinary Board shall fill any proceeding. vacancies on any Conference Panel or Hearing Panel caused by challenges with another member of the Board from the same order as the person challenged. In the event there is no remaining member of the Board from the same order to fill a vacancy on a Conference Panel or a Hearing Panel, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, may appoint a person from the same order qualified to serve on the Disciplinary Board to fill the vacancy. Such person shall serve on the Panel in question only until the completion of the proceedings before the Panel. The Board may establish rules consistent with this Canon for considering and acting upon such challenges.

Section 44.9 Intake Officer

The Intake Officer shall be a Priest or Deacon or adult confirmed communicant in good standing of the Church in the Diocese appointed from time to time by the Bishop after consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board. The Bishop may appoint one or more Intake Officers according to the needs of the Diocese. The Bishop shall publish the name and contact information of each Intake Officer throughout the Diocese.

Section 44.10 Investigator

The Bishop shall appoint one or more Investigators in consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board. Each Investigator may, but need not, be a member of the Church.

Section 44.11 Advisors

In each proceeding under Title IV, the Bishop shall appoint an Advisor for the Complainant and an Advisor for the Respondent. Persons serving as Advisors shall hold no other appointed or elected position provided for under this Canon, and shall not include Chancellors or Vice-Chancellors of this Diocese or any person likely to be called as a witness in the proceeding.

Section 44.12 Church Attorney

Within two months after each Annual Diocesan Council, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board, shall appoint a Church Attorney to serve for a term of one year and until his or her successor is duly appointed and qualified. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Church Attorney, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, shall appoint a successor to serve the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office. The Bishop may remove the Church Attorney for any good and sufficient reason, as determined in the Bishop's sole judgment. If, in any particular proceeding, the Church Attorney is unable to represent the Church for any reason, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, may appoint a substitute Church Attorney for that particular proceeding. The Church Attorney and any successor or substitute must be an adult confirmed communicant in good standing of the Church in this Diocese and a duly licensed attorney.

Section 44.13 Clerk and Assistant Clerks

The Disciplinary Board shall appoint a Clerk and, if necessary, Assistant Clerks, to assist the Board with records management and administrative support. Each Clerk shall be a Priest or Deacon or adult confirmed communicant in good standing of the Church in the Diocese and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. The Clerk and any Assistant Clerk may be a member of the Board.

Section 44.14 Conflict

Should any provision of this Canon conflict with Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church, the latter shall prevail.

Section 44.15 *Expenses of the Diocese*

The reasonable costs and expenses of the Disciplinary Board, the Intake Officer, the Investigator, the Church Attorney, the Advisors, and the Clerk shall be the responsibility of this Diocese. Any legal fees and costs incurred by the Respondent shall be the responsibility of the Respondent. In the event of a final Order dismissing the complaint, the reasonable legal fees and costs incurred by the Respondent may, in the Bishop's sole discretion, be reimbursed by the Diocese. The record of proceedings of the Board shall be the expense of the Diocese. Expenses of the Diocese relating to disciplinary proceedings under Title IV shall be deemed to be necessary and proper expenses of the Diocese and shall be included in the assessment budget.

SUBMITTED BY: The Rev'd David Puckett-rector, Holy Spirit, Houston.

RATIONALE (by Rev'd Puckett):

The proposed amendment to Canon 44 has been drafted by the Chancellor after close study of the requirements of new Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church dealing with clergy discipline. The Chancellor has also prepared for your consideration the following explanation of the proposed amendment:

The purpose of existing Canon 44 is to implement in this Diocese the requirements of existing Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church dealing with clergy discipline. In 2009 General Convention adopted a wholesale revision of Title IV, which becomes effective on July 1, 2011. The new Title IV is set forth in the 2009 Constitution & Canons, which can be found on line at http://generalconvention.org/gc/publications. New Title IV sets forth comprehensive procedures for clergy discipline that will apply in every diocese. But new Title IV leaves it to each diocese to create by diocesan canon the infrastructure within that diocese necessary to perform those clergy disciplinary procedures.

The purpose of these changes to Canon 44 then is to provide for the creation and selection of the Disciplinary Board and other diocesan officers required to implement new Title IV. The rationale for the specific changes is as follows:

(a) The changes to Section 44.1 are to provide for the effective date of the new Canon 44 and on that date to repeal the existing Canon 44.

(b) Section 44.2 converts the existing Ecclesiastical Trial Court into the Disciplinary Board mandated by new Title IV and the role of the Presiding Judge of that Court into the role of President of the Disciplinary Board. In addition, new Title IV requires the diocesan canon to specify whether a member of the Standing Committee may serve on the Disciplinary Board.

(c) Sections 44.3 through 44.7 continue with respect to the new Disciplinary Board the existing provisions for the election of members of the Ecclesiastical Trial Court and the filling of any vacancies on the Court. (d) New Title IV requires each diocese to provide a system for challenges as to the membership of any Conference Panel or Hearing Panel of the Disciplinary Board. Section 44.8 fulfills that requirement by establishing a standard for disqualification of a Panel member, a method of determining a challenge, and a method for filling any vacancy on a Panel as a result of the disqualification of a member. It eliminates the existing peremptory challenge allowed to either the Respondent or Church Attorney because it is impractical with Panels consisting of only three members and in any event is inconsistent with the spirit of new Title IV. Note that no diocesan action is required to create Conference Panels or Hearing Panels because under Title IV the President of the Disciplinary Board appoints other members of the Board to constitute those Panels on a case by case basis.

(e) Sections 44.9 through 44.13 create the positions and provide the method of selection of the Intake Officer, Investigator, Advisors, Church Attorney, and Clerks that are required for the new disciplinary procedures of Title IV.

(f) The reasons for the repeal of existing Sections 44.9 through 44.29 are that either (i) those provisions are already covered by new Title IV and hence require no further diocesan implementation or (ii) they are inconsistent with the new Title IV disciplinary procedures.

(g) Section 44.15 continues current practice with respect to the allocation of the expenses of clergy disciplinary proceedings with the exception that it now allows, at the Bishop's sole discretion, the reimbursement of the legal fees and expenses incurred by a Respondent if the charges against the Respondent are ultimately dismissed.

THE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDS ADOPTION OF THIS PROPOSAL.

Following brief explanation, the Committee moved to adopt. A motion was made to amend Section 44.12 by deleting (in the third sentence), the phrase "in the Bishop's sole judgment" and replacing it with the phrase "by the Bishop after consultation with the President of the Board." The proposed amendment was seconded, and after brief debate, was adopted by a standing vote which followed an inconclusive voice vote. A proposal was made to amend Section 44.11 by inserting, after the word "Bishop" in the first sentence, the phrase "after consultation with the Complainant and the Respondent." The Bishop accepted this as an editorial change. The main motion as amended was then adopted by a standing vote, a previous voice vote having been inconclusive. The Committee then presented the following new canon:

Canon 49 PASTORAL CARE

Section 1: Clergy in this diocese shall be permitted to offer and to officiate at a prayer service for couples making commitment to one another, to God, and to the Church for whom a registration of marriage with the State may incur extraordinarily punitive consequences or for whom the sacrament of Holy Matrimony is canonically inaccessible.

Section 2: Clergy shall provide pastoral care, discernment, and spiritual formation in preparation for the use of such service of prayer.

Section 3: No clergy shall be required to officiate at any such service of prayer.

Section 4: Clergy shall respect and express the Church's teaching that Holy Matrimony is the desired norm for Christian couples making commitment to one another, to God, and to the Church.

THE COMMITTEE <u>DOES NOT RECOMMEND</u> ADOPTION OF THIS PROPOSAL.

The motion to adopt was made from the Council floor and was seconded. Discussion followed. The following amendment was made: In Section 49.1, following the phrase "with the State," delete "incur extraordinarily punitive consequences" and substitute "may be prohibited..." Also, to add to Section 49.1 the following sentence "Any prayer service pursuant to this canon must be submitted in writing to the Bishop of the Diocese for approval at least thirty days prior to its proposed use, and If not disapproved fifteen days before the proposed use, it will be deemed approved." The motion was seconded and discussion followed. In the interim while the amendment was being written, the Bishop requested the Chaplain to pray for discernment. On a voice vote, the amendment was not adopted. Brief discussion continued on the original proposal. The question being called and seconded was adopted on a voice vote. The main motion was then not adopted on a voice vote.

The Reverend David Puckett, chair of the Committee on the Bishop's Address, presented the following resolutions from that address (the resolutions were moved separately and adopted on a voice vote separately in turn):

Resolved that this 162nd Council of the Diocese of the Texas will both by prayer—and I am hoping that that is action—support this good and necessary work, remembering that while we are not all of one mind, we love our Diocese and the Episcopal Church and commit to one another as a family and we therefore commit to respectfully seeking a solution for our Diocese.

2

Whereas our Bishop has inspired us in his address to step across the cultural divide and into the new millennium; and

Whereas the world around us as partners will join in providing healthy, fulfilling, life-giving and dignity-bound ministry; and

Whereas we are called as followers of Jesus Christ as Savior of the world, we are by that identity to seek through his direction the work as agents of transformation and restoration in our communities; be it

Resolved that this 162nd Diocesan Council be called to make faithful witness by praying in the spirit of hopefulness, living in the expectation of change, and working as entrepreneurs in a new missionary age.

Whereas Bishop Doyle has called for the Episcopal Network for Stewardship to lead a gathering for this ministry on June 3 through 4, 2011, at Camp Allen; be it

Resolved that this 162nd Diocesan Council encourages all its members to attend this gathering and commit to pray for this purpose under the direction of the Holy Spirit. Whereas we are called by our Lord Christ to go into all the world as His disciples; and

Whereas our Bishop has placed before us both the challenge and opportunity to build evangelism connections across the country; and

Whereas Bishop Doyle has set forth the Gathering for Evangelism on November 11 and 12, 2011, at Camp Allen; be it

Resolved that this 162nd Diocesan Council encourages all its members to attend this gathering and commit to pray for this purpose under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

Whereas we are the inheritors of the ancient story of God, calling people from all lands into covenant and then sending that people into the world to make God known in Jesus Christ; and

Whereas we are many members of the one body of Christ in God's holy catholic and apostolic church; and

Whereas the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, a part of the worldwide Anglican Communion, is made up of many diverse peoples of wide-ranging views, many varying cultures and nations, differing politics, liturgical practices, and definitions of self; and

Resolved that this 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas honor the ministry of Bishop High by raising a purse to be given to him upon his retirement.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the delegates of the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas honor Bishop High's servant leadership as Canon for Pastoral Ministry and ministry with the St. Luke's Episcopal Healthcare System.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that the delegates of the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas recognize Bishop High as a global leader and visionary for faith-based healthcare in creating and implementing the Anglican Health Network, the Anglican Consultative Council's ninth Network to serve God's people throughout the world.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the delegates of the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas affirm Bishop High's legacy of health and leadership for the Diocese.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the delegates of the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas gratefully acknowledge the partnership of Pat High in this bishop's ministry, and wish them Godspeed, good health, and joy in their retirement.

WHEREAS, the Right Reverend Rayford B. High, Jr. has faithfully served the Episcopal Diocese of Texas as Bishop Suffragan in the piney woods of East Texas since 2003; and

WHEREAS, his servant leadership among us has led us more fully into a people of mission and ministry called by God; and

WHEREAS, he has been more than a bishop but a pastor and friend to countless laity, clergy, and bishops of the Episcopal Church; and

WHEREAS, his episcopacy in the Diocese of Texas is the culmination of forty-four years as a deacon, priest, and bishop in our "daughter" diocese of West Texas, the Diocese of Texas, and as a pastoral and faithful Bishop in the Church of God; and rooted in the steadfast love and unwavering support of Pat High, his wife; and

WHEREAS, she has shared with the people of this diocese the gift of her own ministry of hospitality, hope and joy,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the 162nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas gives abundant thanks to God for the Highs and the many years of faithful friendship, witness to God's love and ministry to this diocese, the Episcopal Church, and the world.

The motion to adopt all of the "Courtesy Resolutions" was made and adopted on a voice vote.

Nominations by the Bishop (printed copies of which had been distributed earlier on the floor of Council) were, without objection, moved for adoption. The motion was seconded and adopted on a voice vote. Copies of appointments by the Bishop were also distributed.

The Treasurer moved that the Council offerings of \$4,364.95 be given to the Diocese of Haiti for help in the reconstruction of their Cathedral. The motion was seconded and passed on a voice vote.

On behalf of the congregations of St. Andrew's, Bryan, and St. Thomas', St. Francis', and Canterbury, College Station, the Reverend Sean Cox issued an invitation to the 163rd Council of the Diocese of Texas to be held in Bryan/College Station on February 10–11, 2012. The motion to accept the invitation was made, seconded, and "whooped."

The Secretary announced that there was no unfinished business to come before the 162nd Council.

The Bishop presented gifts to Maggie Immler for her work with the Episcopal Disaster and Relief efforts in Galveston restoration.

Bishop Doyle adjourned the 162nd Annual Council of the Diocese of Texas and closed the meeting with prayer and his Blessing.

2011 Council Address Episcopal Diocese of Texas The Rt. Rev'd C. Andrew Doyle

Lemhi (LEMhigh) Pass is at the boarder of Montana and Idaho. There is a wooden fence there, a cattle guard crossing, and a logging road. The exact spot is today as "pristine" as you can get. One arrives there by way of the Missouri River from Fort Benton to Fort Peck Lake along the Lolo trail. And, when you stand there it looks as in many ways it looked when he stood there on the morning of August 12, 1805.ⁱ

With friends nearby he made his way to the top. He described that moment clearly in his journal. He wrote: "We proceeded on the top of the dividing ridge from which I discovered immense ranges of high mountains still to the West of us with their tops partially covered with snow."ⁱⁱ

Meriwether Lewis was the first white American to look on the great northwestern range; the first to take a step out of the Louisiana territory onto the western side of the Continental Divide.ⁱⁱⁱ

One might wonder what he felt in that moment. We don't know of course. Lewis was silent about his feelings on this and on most things. However, in that moment one can imagine two great worlds colliding. Two thoughts happening at the same time; neither one fully formed.

The first thought had to be the disheartening sight. Imagine "the shock, the surprise," John Logan Allen (historiographer and author) muses, "for from the top of that ridge were to be seen neither the great river that had been promised nor the open plains extending to the shores of the South Sea…the geography of hope [gave way] to the geography of reality."^{iv} The whole journey to find a western portage that one might travel from East to West across the United States by boat was a failure. Everything he was sure of finding was not only not *there* it was never to be. The dream that had framed one year of study and preparation then two years of travel across wild country to this moment was over.

The second thought was the sight of the great empire of the Americas. In that look he took in with one measure from the east and all that lay behind him to the west and all that lay ahead a wealth and abundance of a new territory and the even greater spectacle of fertile land and spirit that was becoming the United States. In an age where transportation, energy, and food had not much changed since the Greeks, Meriwether Lewis saw in its rawest form the bounty of a quickly forming nation that we were to become.

Two thoughts not fully formed, which forever changed who we were and were to become and as Americans.

Two thoughts not fully formed. Today we, the Diocese of Texas, are becoming something new but are not sure what yet. We are being transformed and forged in a fiery furnace of sweeping change.

Not unlike Meriwether Lewis that morning, this morning, our geography is giving way beneath our feet. We see clearly the past and the reality of our situation. And, we see the future and all that God intends for us.

The first thought is realizing our feet are firmly planted in a stale geography where the world and church we thought would carry us forward is no longer systemically viable.

As a church we have an economy. It is like any other at its very basic level one that is dependent upon income and expenditures. Our current economy, way of doing things, doesn't work. It is forever changed. When it happened I do not know exactly. It is probably an event that did not happen all at once but crept in and is even now more fully upon us; though we cannot yet fully comprehend its impact on our mission and ministry. We have been treating the symptoms while the system crumbles.

We have consistently believed...

...that those who are called by God to be Episcopalians will find us and come through our doors.

...that once they were inside our doors they would stay because of our awesome liturgy.

...that someday we will grow again – then we can take care of our deferred maintenance.

...that all we need is the right clergy person. After all, we are not accountable.

...that if we just solved the issue of the day one way or the other we would surge in growth. If we were just true to the past...or if we were just true to the future...

The problem is that fewer and fewer people every year seek us out and react positively to our attempts to deal with the symptoms. Meanwhile, we are out performed by the culture around us. We no longer have the market cornered on community life, networking, social services, weddings, funerals, and care. We are out performed by others: social media, bars, gyms, sports clubs, funeral homes, JPs, hospitals and friends.

Our budgets themselves reveal that the economic reality of our ministry is not sustainable. In 1997 a congregation with 50 people could support itself with a budget of \$100,000. Today it takes a congregation of more than 100 and a budget upwards of \$150,000 to \$180,000 a year. Without debt this congregation, depending on the health of its buildings and deferred maintenance, might be able to afford a full-time minister

and the cost of keeping the facilities open. However, this congregation has very little extra money for mission or outreach.

By the end of 2011 inflation is estimated to reach 2%. So by 2012 a congregation will see its expenses jump some \$3,000 dollars without doing anything. That means this church will have to add a family who begins life as an Episcopalian giving the diocesan average pledge of \$3,508 just to cover the cost of keeping the lights on.

We are operating out of a model that depends upon assumptions about our culture that date to the mid-century of the last millennium.

This is a painful acknowledgement because we didn't ask for the dream to change; didn't have a whole lot to do with the change; and are powerless to make the change stop.

No matter how many times we blink our eyes or pretend it is not happening it remains true. We stand at the Lemhi pass like Meriwether Lewis. And, we see it clearly. The dream that has framed our very core of being, the one that we prepared our whole lives to undertake, the one we are structured and organized to run, the dream we have been supporting is over.

Continuing this church economy, doing the things we have been doing for the last three decades leads only to greater conflict and loss. Continuing to be church, simply tinkering with efficiency and symptoms leads unequivocally to closure.

However, at this very same moment we stand on the pass with a second thought not yet fully formed but forming. That thought is that you and I stand on the edge of a new missionary age – a new geography of hope. We have not been called to be lords in an age of empire but entrepreneurs in an age of mission.

Our new missionary economy must add value to the culture around us.

We must be about the missionary work of transforming the world around us – our environment, the economy itself, and the societies of our neighborhoods and cities. People's lives must be better tomorrow because our Episcopal Church is there proclaiming the Good News of Salvation.

We must engage a new design aligning our church economy with the realities of the 21st century mission field.

We have the opportunity to rethink systematically how we will walk into this geography of hope.

The economies that will flourish in the 21st century will be ones that give *life* to people, their community, and the environment in which they live. We must invest in relationship oriented community and individual and environmental transformation.

We have the opportunity in this new missionary age to claim a sustainable mission deeply rooted in our values as Anglicans who are unabashedly Episcopalian.

The world around is hoping for partners who will join in providing healthy, fulfilling, life giving and dignity bound ministry to the communities in which they live.

The world is looking for partners interested in building a sustainable creation.

The world is looking for partners who will nurture relationships helping one another to have a better wholesome life.

We realize as we stand here on the edge between two different mission mindsets, two different church economic theories that our current system must change if we are to lead across the cultural divide into the new millennium.

A new church economy will serve as a system to take us into the future as a healthy community of Christians who benefit the world around us proclaiming and making real the salvation of Christ.

We must step onto the other side of the divide with all its unknowns. But we do not do that without friends or untethered. As the Episcopal Diocese of Texas we take our steps together tethered to our vision and mission. Who we are and how we understand our ministry helps us by being the bedrock and foundation of hope for every step we take in this new geography.

We are called through Jesus Christ to build the Kingdom of God together through worship, witness, and ministry.

We understand that as individuals and as a sacred community we are one Church reconciled by Jesus Christ.

We are reconciled to God and to one another through the power of Jesus Christ.

We are empowered by the Holy Spirit through worship, witness and ministry.

The Holy Spirit, the empowering agent of Godly life, transforms and binds us, individual sinners, into a divine community of virtuous citizens.

This is the family of God, the community called the Church, working outwardly, on a daily basis, the inner life of the Holy Trinity. The mission of true virtue is to create a worldly but divine community, the kingdom of God, on "earth as it is in heaven."

We can gauge our steps into the new frontier by the following marks of the new missionary age. In the life of our diocese and in our congregations we will realize:

- A ministry that transforms and restores changing the world around us in concert with Christ's resurrection work.
 - A great example of this is our renewed and collaborative partnership with Episcopal Relief and Development.
 - Beginning with relief efforts focused on the Gulf Coast following Ike, we have put to work nearly a million dollars over a three year period. \$400,000 from the foundations of the diocese to aid congregations with expenses and to rebuild. ERD contributed \$200,000+ over the same period. And, people across the diocese and country offered another \$370,000 in additional dollars. Gutting houses, rebuilding, helping our churches get started again, renewing lives and transforming the lives of the thousands who served as volunteers.
 - Our coordinated restoration and management earned recognition and our leaders including Russ Oechsel and Maggie Immler have been asked to help coach and assist others in responding to emergencies across the country.
 - We are also taking steps to lead with a *Nets for Life* campaign which you will hear about later.
- Another mark of the missionary age is exceptional stewardship stewardship of the resources of time, talent, and money entrusted to us.
 - St. Mary's West Columbia is a great example of a congregation who recently sold to the Nature Conservancy the last piece of pristine Texas coastal prairie. We were involved in restoring, caring for and ensuring for future generations a piece of Texas history and a section of land with geographical and species diversity. The impact is tremendous as the letter I received from the Houston chapter of the Audubon Society noted. The people of the diocese partnered with others in conserving and safeguarding God's creation and in so doing makes a permanent place were God in all of God's glory is revealed in the wonder of creation.
 - This year we are partnering with The Episcopal Network for Stewardship in a collaborative leap to build connections across the country and raise our understanding of the meaning and impact exceptional stewardship can have on the church economy. The gathering will be June 3 and 4, 2011 this year at Camp Allen.
 - Exceptional stewardship also means that we must rethink Mission Funding and the outreach ministries of the diocese. We can no longer fund the way we have been funding our common work for the past three decades. While the methodology changed slightly with "freedom of choice" and then

"mission funding" the truth is that we continue today to fund and structure our common mission and ministry the way we did in the 1980s. No entrepreneurial mission minded organization funds the way they did in the 1980's.

- William Isaac, former chairman of the US Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, wrote: "A financial system that does not take risks is a financial system that is not supporting entrepreneurship and growth."
- We must employ in entrepreneurial fiscal leadership in this new missionary age.
- I have challenged the Church Corporation to work with David Fisher in our office to provide for the congregations of the diocese a planned giving campaign that helps congregations provide legacy giving for the future mission of the church.
- The third mark of the new missionary age is excellence in mission
 - Excellence in mission means that we will embrace a culture of evangelism that is particularly our own.
 - To this end we will hold an Evangelism Conference November 11 and 12 of 2011. We will look at emerging and the leading principles of greenfield evangelism, front door evangelism, and evangelism through technology.
 - We hope at that time also to roll out a diocesan wide evangelism project.
 - Church Planting is another place where we must engage in missionary excellence. We are going to have to become strategic in our funding for new growth. I have outlined and am working with all of the foundations on a clear strategic funding plan for grants that will support new starts, satellites, evangelism and newcomer initiatives.
 - Last year I formed a Task Force on church planting that is working on a theology in sync with diocesan vision. They are looking at types of new starts, potential sites and projects that will need new development in the years to come. They are taking the initiative and looking at how to drive excellence in mission throughout our diocesan structure and offerings.

We will know we are making progress towards the vision of the kingdom transforming the world because Average Sunday Attendance will increase in the diocese but more importantly:

week day attendance on every campus will increase

• Church and community partnership will increase in frequency.

We will know we are making progress when we see Baptisms, confirmations, and receptions increase in the diocese, but more importantly:

- The numbers of people who associate themselves with the Episcopal church will grow
- The numbers of people who participate in common mission with the Episcopal church will grow
- We will be known as a diocese and as a local church that welcomes, cares, and befriends

We will know we are making progress when the median age of the membership of our church decreases to reflect our mission context – the counties in which the diocese is located.

We will know we are making progress when our leadership (clergy and laity) is younger and more diverse ethnically – reflecting our mission context.

We will know we are making progress when existing congregations take the initiative for planting new congregations.

We will know when we see our institutions show growth in numbers, finances, and in community impact.

We will know we are making progress when we see:

- more churches
- more emerging communities
- more schools
- more clinics
- more outreach ministries and centers

We will know when we have three fully funded endowments:

- Great Commission Fund which underwrites and supports new congregations
- Leadership Development Fund which builds leadership formation and capacity

 Clergy Wellness Fund – which supports the health care cost and wellness initiatives for clergy and their families

We will know we are making our way into the new missionary age when no issue that is secondary to the basics of our faith divides us and keeps us from our mission.^v

No issue will keep us from our mission.

We are making progress today. Last year the resolutions committee worked to bring people together to help present legislation that united the council around a common issue of concern. We should be proud of their work.

This year in September and October our nation's headlines were filled with stories of people who were bullied. Our resolution committee has risen to the challenge after receiving multiple resolutions and has put together one resolution which in my mind captures our willingness to work together on a common issue of a Gospel importance.

Now, let me tell you what I think about this...The real test for us though will be if we actually do something about bullying in our communities. Passing a resolution is good, but as Episcopalians our baptismal covenant does not ask to enact the Gospel legislatively, Jesus wants us to change people's lives. I encourage you to not simply act here on the floor of council as your conscience dictates on these issues, but stand up and act to protect those who are bullied in your schools, workplaces, and within your families.

Another example of where I am seeing people come together is in a conversation with me around the unity and mission of the diocese as we move towards General Convention 2012. I have spent the last year preparing to call the Task Force on Unity together. Their task will be to present to Council in 2012 our plan for leading through the unfolding events of General Convention.

I did have to change the plan for the Task Force in mid-stream as it became clear that the Liturgical Commission was going to present their work in an alternative service book for the Episcopal Church. This particular approach meant thinking clearly about how I will personally approach the debate on sexuality in 2012. Instead of the role of mediator I am now in the role of leader and will be making key decisions about our future.

That being said I am working with Secretary James Baker on my leadership. He has been most gracious with his time and attention. I spent six months working on a proposal. I have spent another six months editing with the help of individuals across every spectrum on the issue of sexuality. I have been in conversation with bishops in the House about their strategies and have listened carefully to their advice, and we have shared ideas. I have listened carefully. I am writing a text on the sacrament and theology of marriage. And, I am today half way through the very careful and intentional invitations to individuals across our diocese and across every theological spectrum to join me in this work of leadership. It is very clear we are not all of one mind, but we love the our diocese and we love the Episcopal Church and we are committed to one another as family members and are committed to listening and seeking a solution for our diocese.

So, we are making progress in our unity and respect for one another.

How do we move from where we are today, at the edge of a new era, capitalizing on our strengths and resources, to become the diocese intended by God?

We will realize the expectations of our missionary contexts through Formation, Leadership, and Connecting People.

We are making headway now in the area of Formation.

We are launching the Communion Covenant Curriculum developed by a task force with a feedback loop to the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church. The task force will report to us at next year's council.

I have made it clear that I support the proposed Anglican Covenant and that this is a landmark moment for our communion. I believe this an important opportunity and deserves time by every congregation to understand better who we are and the changing communion and world around us.

I have heard people say that the Covenant moves us from a generous flexibility toward a brittle rigidity. The statements of faith presented are those that have for a long time been part of who we are as Episcopalians and Anglicans. There is no prescription in the Covenant that does not embrace the middle way for the sake of comprehension or require less generous flexibility within our missionary contexts.

I encourage you to take seriously this important moment in the life of our church and our communion and to engage the Covenant curriculum materials.

The focus of the curriculum helps members of our diocese better understand who we are as Anglicans and Episcopalians.

Understanding who we are as Episcopalians is the same undergirding principle I had when I put together the search committee led by the Rev. Susan Kennard to discern and find a new Canon for Life Long Formation. After doing a national search they offered to us three candidates. Your diocesan staff interviewed all three, and we together selected Mr. John Newton who until two weeks ago served as the Missioner on the college campus of the University of Texas. We are excited about the vision Canon Newton brings to this ministry and the new ideas and creativity that he will offer to the diocese.

We are making headway today in Leadership.

We are expanding our Iona School ministry and will be partnering with the dioceses of Mississippi, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Northwest Texas, West Texas, and Nebraska to build communities and share our classes. This work is a leadership partnership between the Seminary of the Southwest and our diocese. We have Bishop Harrison to thank for this incredible work.

I am also very pleased with her clear leadership of the Seminary. Along with Dean Doug Travis and the faculty the Seminary is not only becoming the largest seminary west of the Mississippi but in my estimation will soon be the second largest seminary program in the country next to Virginia Seminary.

Bishop Harrison's leadership with a number of other institutions is revealing itself as a gift not only to me but the vitality of the diocese.

Last night we had a wonderful roast and toast of Bishop High. We are grateful for his friendship and for his ministry. He has been a leader and he has truly given us, the people of the diocese his very best. He has not done that alone, and so it was right that we celebrate Pat and her ministry too. Clergy spouses know of her kindness and her love of them. You don't get Rayford without Pat smiling next to him. It has been a pleasure.

I am asking that the Diocese of Texas raise a purse for Bishop High in gratitude for his ministry and that it be collected and given to him upon his retirement.

One of the gifts that Bishop High has given us is that he has formed and made clear an understanding of the importance and vocation of a regional bishop.

I had originally been counseled and perhaps out of my own newness as bishop thought that we should have an assisting bishop. However, the suffragan bishops of the diocese have been beloved, bishops Goddard, Cilley, Charlton, Alard, and Sterling to name only a few. I have realized in the last year that I trust the diocese in this work of discernment and that we do need to elect a suffragan.

However, as I have mentioned in the past elections are expensive and we need to save and prepare in order to do this election well. I am proposing therefore the following plan.

I am asking the diocese by way of this council to allow me to call an assisting Bishop. This will give me the canonical permission needed to hire if I indeed find one. The money is in the budget and we are ready to do so. This has already been approved by the Standing Committee.

I am also proposing that in the event I do not find someone that the monies are used to provide Episcopal presence throughout the diocese by inviting visiting bishops who are retired to help with the work load.

I will also propose saving the funds not used and placing them in an account that can grow in 2011 and 2012 into an election fund.

I will also appoint a committee to work under the direction of the Standing Committee and Executive Board for the development of a profile and description of a regional bishop for East Texas and that such a process begin immediately.

As a point of clarification, I will plan to return to the 163rd Diocesan Council in 2012 and call for the election of a Suffragan Bishop for East Texas to be held at Council in 2013.

We are making headway today in the area of building and making Connections locally and globally.

We launched our new website yesterday. The new site moves us from a site devoted to telling people what we want to a site committed to helping people find what they need, connect with others doing great work, and provide an online tool for the sharing of news and information between congregations and institutions.

This launch is part of an overall communication plan which is connected to a new magazine that will share the good news of Christ at work in and through the diocese.

This new look and new presentation of the Diocese is placed firmly within a news strategy of pushing information out through various forms of social networking, creating an ever greater web of communicators throughout the diocese.

We are reaching more and more people across our diocese and across the global church.

Carol Barnwell and LaShane Eaglin do the work of a much larger staff and have risen to the challenge of a new bishop's ideas about communication. When given the opportunity to hire an employee to replace their secretary they developing a job description and made a strategic hire; bringing on board Luke Blount as a writer, and leader in social networking and media arts.

As your ambassador I am helping us make connections across the Episcopal Church and the global communion. One such connection is with the diocese of Haiti. Through the House of Bishops I met Bishop Zache Duracin, the bishop of the largest Diocese in the Episcopal Church, the Diocese of Haiti. He and I were at table together for my first year and a half in the house. While in England for the Compass Rose meeting I was able to spend some time with him and to hear of the miraculous work they are doing in Haiti. The Diocese has given through the Episcopal Foundation of Texas \$10,000. During 2010 alone people and congregations sent more than \$44,000. Leaders have over the last two years given dollars, time, and talent. Together I believe we can say that the people of our diocese have given over \$100,000 dollars directly and indirectly to the rebuild effort. But we are not done yet. There is more work. We must help them rebuild the national cathedral there which is of great historic, artistic, cultural, and communal importance. Moreover, we must help them to rebuild their country. This is a ministry we must do in partnership with them. Bishop Duracin has asked for more funding and we will make another gift this year. However, we are going to work with the Episcopal Church's campaign. You will be hearing more about this as I have appointed my Archdeacon Russ Oechsel to head this up.

Last year the Council asked that the Executive Board look at extending the Council by one day. The Executive Board has reported in volume one of the journal that they did not believe this was a good idea. However, I have worked with Camp Allen and a few leaders in the diocese and it has been decided that JoAnne and I will host the first annual Episcopal Diocese of Texas Family Reunion and Blue Grass Festival at Camp Allen on the weekend of May 11, 2012. We hope this will be an opportunity for us to make connections within the wider family of the diocese; connections and relationships outside the work of mission and ministry and business. Please mark your calendars and plan to join us.

Conclusion

Before I conclude I wish to say that I have been gifted two incredible suffragan bishops, bishop High and Bishop Harrison. I would ask you to please show what I know is your deep and heartfelt gratitude for their service and ministry.

I am not foolish enough to lead this diocese without your wisdom and partnership.

I also am so very grateful for your diocesan staff. Will the staff in the room please rise. They labor vigorously on your behalf. It is upon their shoulders I stand more often than not. It is upon their tireless efforts that I depend. Most of all of course is my assistant Stephanie Taylor. You know, JoAnne knows, we all know I could not do it without her partnership and support.

And, there is JoAnne. I am grateful for being able to walk this ministry with you. I am grateful for your continuous support of the diocese by your support of me. I am grateful for your honesty and your love. As everyone knows who knows you...I married far above my station...thank God.

The truth is that it is us; we the people called the Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Texas do this work.

We have a mission.

We have values that define how we see the world: ministry and mission that is transformational, exceptional stewardship, excellence in mission.

Every congregation and every institution is continuously engaging in the work of formation, leadership, and connection for the sole purpose of realizing potential given our missionary context.

We are on the precipice of a new age of mission.

I would not want to take my steps into the wilderness before us without you, the people of the diocese, who I am proud and honored to call friends and humbled to serve as bishop.

My hope is that at the last day we will have dared, with entrepreneurial spirits, to see the glory of God and the challenge before us as an opportunity for service and mission and not a stumbling block to be feared.

And, that as President Thomas Jefferson said of Meriwether Lewis:

- ...That it may be said of us that we were of great courage and undaunted.
- ... That we were not be diverted from our task nor God's direction.
- ...And that there was no hesitation but fidelity in our cause and in our mission.vi

May we with steadfast faith and fervent prayer ask for God's grace and power to enliven our wills for the work that is before us. In the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. [Amen]

CANONICAL AMENDMENT ADOPTED

Canon 44 DISCIPLINE

Section 44.1 *Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church*

In all matters of ecclesiastical discipline, effective July 1, 2011, the Diocese shall follow and be governed by Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church as adopted at General Convention in 2009, and as amended from time to time hereafter. Except as otherwise expressly provided or when the content otherwise requires, capitalized words as used in this Canon shall have the same meanings as those set forth in Title IV, Canon 2 of the Canons of the Episcopal Church. The predecessor to this Diocesan Canon shall stand repealed on July 1, 2011.

Section 44.2 *Disciplinary Board*

There shall be within and for the Diocese a Disciplinary Board consisting of seven members, four Priests or Deacons, whose actual residence and canonical residence is within this Diocese, and three lay adult confirmed communicants in good standing of the Church in this Diocese. A member of the Standing Committee may serve on the Disciplinary Board. Annually, within two months following each Annual Diocesan Council, the members of the Disciplinary Board shall elect a President from its members. The President shall serve for a term of one year and until his or her successor is hereby elected and qualified.

Section 44.3 *Members*

Members of the Disciplinary Board shall be divided into three classes and elected on nomination of the Bishop at the Annual Council of the Diocese. The composition of each class shall be as follows:

Class 1 shall be composed of two Priests or Deacons and one qualified lay person; Class 2 shall be composed of one Priest or Deacon and one qualified lay person; and

Class 3 shall be composed of one Priest or Deacon and one qualified lay person.

At the Annual Council of the Diocese held in 2011, the members of all classes shall be elected on nomination of the Bishop for the following terms:

Class 1 - 3 years Class 2 - 2 years Class 3 - 1 year

In each subsequent Annual Council, the member or members of each class whose terms expire shall be elected for a three-year term. No member of the Disciplinary Board who has served a full three-year term shall succeed himself or herself after the expiration of his or her full term, but he or she shall be eligible for reelection after the lapse of one year from the expiration of such full term.

Section 44.4 Vacancy

The death, disability rendering a person unable to act, termination of canonical residence in the Diocese, termination of place of abode within this Diocese, Renunciation of Ministry in the case of a Priest or Deacon, or resignation or declination (after election) to serve as a member of the Disciplinary Board shall constitute a vacancy on the Board.

Section 44.5 Notice

Notice of resignations, declinations to serve, or renunciation shall be given by members of the Disciplinary Board in writing to the President of the Board.

Section 44.6 Election to the Episcopate or Ordination

If any Priest elected to the Disciplinary Board is elected a Bishop, or if any lay person elected to the Disciplinary Board is ordained, that person shall immediately cease to be a member of the Board. If either event occurs when the person is serving on a Hearing Panel and proceedings before the Hearing Panel have begun, the person shall continue to serve until the completion of the proceedings and the issuance of an Order.

Section 44.7 *Filling a Vacancy*

Vacancies occurring in the Disciplinary Board, other than for cause under Section 8 of this Canon, shall be filled by a qualified person from the same order elected on nomination of the Bishop by majority vote of the persons present at the Annual Council meeting immediately following the date on which the vacancy occurred. The person so elected shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person whose vacancy he or she fills and shall be eligible for reelection when such term expires. A vacancy may be filled temporarily until the next Annual Council by a qualified person of the same order elected on nomination of the Bishop by majority vote of the persons present at a regular or special meeting of the Executive Board following the creation of the vacancy.

Section 44.8 *Challenges*

A member of a Conference Panel or Hearing Panel, or person appointed to serve in the place of such member under this Section 8, may be challenged by either the Respondent or the Church Attorney for conflict of interest or undue bias by motion made to the Panel for disqualification of the challenged member. The members of the Panel not the subject of the challenge shall promptly consider the motion and determine whether the challenged Panel member shall be disqualified from participating in that proceeding. The President of the Disciplinary Board shall fill any vacancies on any Conference Panel or Hearing Panel caused by challenges with another member of the Board from the same order as the person challenged. In the event there is no remaining member of the Board from the same order to fill a vacancy on a Conference Panel or a Hearing Panel, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, may appoint a person from the same order qualified to serve on the Disciplinary Board to fill the vacancy. Such person shall serve on the Panel in question only until the completion of the proceedings before the Panel. The Board may establish rules consistent with this Canon for considering and acting upon such challenges.

Section 44.9 Intake Officer

The Intake Officer shall be a Priest or Deacon or adult confirmed communicant in good standing of the Church in the Diocese appointed from time to time by the Bishop after consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board. The Bishop may appoint one or more Intake Officers according to the needs of the Diocese. The Bishop shall publish the name and contact information of each Intake Officer throughout the Diocese.

Section 44.10 Investigator

The Bishop shall appoint one or more Investigators in consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board. Each Investigator may, but need not, be a member of the Church.

Section 44.11 Advisors

In each proceeding under Title IV, the Bishop, after consultation with the Complainant and Respondent, shall appoint an Advisor for the Complainant and an Advisor for the Respondent. Persons serving as Advisors shall hold no other appointed or elected position provided for under this Canon, and shall not include Chancellors or Vice-Chancellors of this Diocese or any person likely to be called as a witness in the proceeding.

Section 44.12 *Church Attorney*

Within two months after each Annual Diocesan Council, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Disciplinary Board, shall appoint a Church Attorney to serve for a term of one year and until his or her successor is duly appointed and qualified. In the event of a vacancy in the office of Church Attorney, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, shall appoint a successor to serve the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office. The Bishop may remove the Church Attorney for any good and sufficient reason, as determined by the Bishop after consultation with the President of the Board. If, in any particular proceeding, the Church Attorney is unable to represent the Church for any reason, the Bishop, in consultation with the President of the Board, may appoint a substitute Church Attorney for that particular proceeding. The Church Attorney and any successor or substitute must be an adult confirmed

communicant in good standing of the Church in this Diocese and a duly licensed attorney.

Section 44.13 Clerk and Assistant Clerks

The Disciplinary Board shall appoint a Clerk and, if necessary, Assistant Clerks, to assist the Board with records management and administrative support. Each Clerk shall be a Priest or Deacon or adult confirmed communicant in good standing of the Church in the Diocese and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board. The Clerk and any Assistant Clerk may be a member of the Board.

Section 44.14 Conflict

Should any provision of this Canon conflict with Title IV of the Canons of the Episcopal Church, the latter shall prevail.

Section 44.15 Expenses of the Diocese

The reasonable costs and expenses of the Disciplinary Board, the Intake Officer, the Investigator, the Church Attorney, the Advisors, and the Clerk shall be the responsibility of this Diocese. Any legal fees and costs incurred by the Respondent shall be the responsibility of the Respondent. In the event of a final Order dismissing the complaint, the reasonable legal fees and costs incurred by the Respondent may, in the Bishop's sole discretion, be reimbursed by the Diocese. The record of proceedings of the Board shall be the expense of the Diocese. Expenses of the Diocese relating to disciplinary proceedings under Title IV shall be deemed to be necessary and proper expenses of the Diocese and shall be included in the assessment budget.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED

(Resolutions from the Bishop's Address and Courtesy Resolutions may be found in the Minutes)

Resolution #1

A Resolution on the Role of the Church in a Time of Public Fear and Scarcity Whereas in this time of economic and geopolitical uncertainty, fear threatens to separate the children of God from one another;

Whereas fear has led to disrespectful public discourse as well as scapegoating, bullying and hate crimes in response to actual, or perceived, differences including those of race, skin color, religion, national origin; sexual orientation, gender, gender identity, disability or immigration status, among others;

Whereas Jesus advocated on behalf of the outcasts of his day. He invited everyone to sit at the table and break bread with Him;

Whereas our congregations benefit from the talents, resources, leadership and unselfish gifts of all sorts and conditions of humanity;

Therefore, be it resolved that the 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas invites every congregation, and every individual, actively to cultivate an ethic of love for all God's children;

Be it further resolved that congregations are encouraged to develop and model the capacity for respectful conversation among those of differing identities and views;

Be it further resolved, that institutions of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas be safe and supportive places for all people including young people;

Be it further resolved that the Episcopal Diocese of Texas denounces bullying, scapegoating, hate crimes and other manifestations of fear;

Be it further resolved, that the Episcopal Diocese of Texas shall publicly support legislative efforts to preserve human dignity.

Resolutions Regarding Criminal Justice, 3a–3f

Resolution #3a

Whereas, Christ came into the world to transform human beings and Scripture calls upon Christians to respect the dignity of every person; be it,

Resolved, that the 162nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas re-commit itself to the Biblical call to forgive those who have offended the law and paid their debt to society and grant them the second chance that Christ offers them recognizing the power of God to transform and in this way, we proclaim release to the captives and set the prisoners free.

Resolution #3b

Whereas, the teachings of the *Old* and *New Testaments* repeatedly call upon the people to fairly apply God's Justice; be it

Resolved by the 162nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas, that justice be recognized as a goal not just for offenders, but most importantly for victims and the community harmed by crime alike.

Resolution #3c

Whereas, the state recognizes that incarceration is not the solution to all lawbreaking; be it

Resolved, that the 162nd Council of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas calls for alternatives to prison for first-time non-violent offenders which make them aware of the harm they have done to others and require accountability, restitution and community service.

Resolution #3d

Whereas, there is much missionary activity engaged in by our people in our parishes and missions that could be replicated in other "missionary outposts" if the people were made aware of the need and the means to do this work; be it

Resolved, that The Episcopal Diocese of Texas request parishes and missions report such activities to the Diocese for the edification of the whole Church; and be it further

Resolved, that the Diocese extends thanks to the many ministries of the church, including those who feed the poor, pray for the sick, clothe the naked, visit the prisoners, mentor to children, provide shelter to the homeless and do other good work.

Resolution #3e

Whereas, our children, next to the Word of God, are our most precious resource; be

it

Resolved, that The Episcopal Diocese of Texas urges the national church to call a conference to share knowledge among the dioceses conducting camps for children of the incarcerated and to invite all non-participating dioceses to explore the possibility of offering similar opportunities to the highest at-risk population (for incarceration) in the United States.

Resolution #3f

Whereas, The Episcopal Church of the United States passed Resolution 2003-A125 (Ministry to Prisoners and their Families); be it

Resolved, that The Episcopal Diocese of Texas, respond to the resolution, which, "urged dioceses and congregations to become familiar with the criminal justice system and form ministries which assist prisoners and their families" following arrest, during trial and incarceration, and during their post release readjustment period; "to support the establishment of and/or expansion of occupational, therapeutic treatment, and academic programs in prison where prisoners may be prepared for re-entry into society; and, be it further

Resolved, that the parishes and missions of the Episcopal Diocese of Texas be firmly committed to a system of justice that seeks to provide the victims and the perpetrators_with rehabilitative services so that healing may take place and citizens can live in peace; and, be it further

Resolved, that to aid in reentry, the Texas Department of Criminal Justice house inmates as close to their family and loved ones as possible and institute programs of its own or with approved volunteers to strengthen positive family relationships and prepare all for harmonious living upon release.

Resolution #4

General Convention Resolution for Mission to Community Colleges

WHEREAS, the Episcopal Diocese of Texas is a leader in the area of mission and evangelism to colleges and universities; and

WHEREAS, the College Missioners' Association of the Diocese of Texas and parishes involved in this mission affirm the need to expand this mission to community colleges;

BE IT RESOLVED, that this 162nd Council of the Diocese of Texas submit the following resolution to the 77th General Convention of The Episcopal Church:

WHEREAS, the House of Deputies concurring, the 77th General Convention of The Episcopal Church reaffirm our commitment to the Episcopal Church Strategic Planning Survey Report's statement that "The Church needs to see campus ministry and young adult ministry as the most important evangelism and mission area there is. It is where our culture is the most dynamic, most committed, most culturally diverse"; and

WHEREAS, The Episcopal Church recognize the increasing importance of community colleges as critical places for evangelism and Christian formation,

particularly among racially, ethnically, and socioeconomically diverse populations;

BE IT RESOLVED, that to respond to this pastoral need, the General Convention support the creation of two new campus ministries at community colleges in each of the nine Provinces of the Episcopal Church, and provide training for local leaders of these mission initiatives; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Convention direct the Office of Young Adult & Campus Ministries at the Episcopal Church Center, in cooperation with the Provincial Coordinators for Campus Ministry, to oversee a process for application for and allocation of grants to fund these new missions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Convention request the Joint Standing Committee on Program, Budget, and Finance to consider a budget allocation of \$760,000 for the implementation of this resolution.

GIFTS AND BEQUESTS

The Church Corporation is authorized, under its charter powers as a Texas Corporation, in addition to its regular corporate powers, to receive, hold, manage, and administer funds and properties acquired by gift, will or otherwise, for the use and benefit of the Diocese and any Diocesan institutions, and may also act as trustee in receiving, holding, managing, and administering funds for the use and benefit of any Parish or Mission in the Diocese. The name of the corporation is PROTESTANT EPISCOPAL CHURCH COUNCIL OF THE DIOCESE OF TEXAS.

Bequests made to the Church Corporation, whether unrestricted or limited to some specific purpose within the Diocese, are deductible in computing federal estate and Texas inheritance taxes. In addition, contributions of such nature made during a donor's lifetime are deductible for federal income tax purposes.
