History of St. Thomas'

Honoring Our Past

CHURCH WAS ESTABLISHED, THE SECOND CHURCH GROUP IN WHARTON COUNTY AND THE FIRST AND ONLY EPISCOPAL CHURCH TO PERMANENTLY ROOT IN THE COUNTY. WORSHIP IN WHARTON BEGAN WITH THE FIRST OFFICIAL SERMON DELIVERED ON MAY 5, 1867, BY RT. REVEREND ALEXANDER GREGG. THE CHURCH WAS RECOGNIZED AS A MISSION IN 1868.

THE FIRST CHURCH BUILDING WAS ERECTED IN 1898 ON MILAM STREET, REBUILT IN 1902. BEGINNING IN MAY 1926, RAYMOND DICKSON OFFERED THE OLD DICKSON HOME FOR USE AS A RECTORY. WHEN THE HOUSE WAS DISMANTLED, THE SALE OF THE LUMBER WAS USED TOWARD FUNDS FOR A NEW RECTORY. A NEW CHURCH BUILDING WAS COMPLETED IN 1951 AND THE OLD BUILDING ON MILAM WAS SOLD.

The Story of St. Thomas'



ST. THOMAS' EPISCOPAL CHURCH

AT THE DIOCESAN CONVENTION OF 1867, ST. THOMAS' EPISCOPAL CHURCH WAS ESTABLISHED, THE SECOND CHURCH GROUP IN WHARTON COUNTY AND THE FIRST AND ONLY EPISCOPAL CHURCH TO PERMANENTLY ROOT IN THE COUNTY. The City of Wharton: Where we Live

History of Wharton

Wharton, the county seat of Wharton County, is on the east bank of the lower Colorado River, forty-five miles from the Gulf of Mexico. It was part of the Caney Run mail route established by the Republic of Texas in 1838.

The community was named after two leaders in the struggle for Texas independence, brothers John and William Wharton. The plantation community was first settled in 1846 by some of Stephen F. Austin's original colonists, and a post office was established in 1847. The first lieutenant governor of Texas, Albert Horton, was an early settler.

Land for the courthouse square was donated by William Kincheloe and surveyed by Virgil Stewart and William J. E. Heard. Early settlers came from Alabama, Kentucky, Virginia, Georgia, and Mississippi. Jewish immigrants, arriving as early as the 1850s, established additional businesses and began the Congregation Shearith Israel, the only synagogue in a three-county area.

Location

Wharton is located on the Colorado River, 30 miles southwest of Sugar Land and 55 miles from downtown Houston. Located 45 miles from the Gulf of Mexico, the elevation is 101 feet.

Education

In addition to primary and secondary education offered by Wharton ISD, Wharton Junior College's main campus is located in the city, offering a diverse range of certification and degree programs.

Government

Wharton's municipal government consists of a Council/Mayor/Manager system. Full-time fire and police personnel serve the city and surrounding area.

Established in 1982, the St. Thomas' Thrift Shop & Outreach Center has been a cornerstone of our church's mission to serve the Wharton community. Located at 530 E. Milam Street, the shop is entirely volunteer-run and operates through the generosity of our parishioners and community partners. All proceeds from the thrift shop directly support our outreach ministry, providing financial assistance for essentials like rent, utilities, temporary lodging, and pharmacy expenses to individuals and families in need. We also collaborate with Wharton County Junior College (WCJC) to offer student volunteer opportunities, fostering a spirit of service and community engagement. Through this ministry, we strive to reflect God's love by meeting practical needs with compassion and dignity.

The Outreach Team at St. Thomas' Episcopal Church is dedicated to serving our neighbors with compassion and purpose, reflecting the love and teachings of Jesus Christ. Our mission is to identify and respond to the needs of our local community by building meaningful partnerships, organizing service projects, and promoting a spirit of generosity and care. Every initiative we take on is deeply rooted in our faith and in alignment with the values of the Episcopal Church.
